Question & Answer 1:

Questions

- 1. Which country in Central America does the project refer to and should all countries be covered by March 31, 2017 (1st winter) or during project extension periods in 2018 and 2019?
- 2. Is there a budget for hiring observers in the countries concerned where the contract refers to voluntary observers from those countries?
- 3. Can you provide a list of bird species targeted by the tender?
- 4. Can you provide details on the objectives of the contract in terms of survey results (e.g., presence / absence of targeted Canadian species, relative abundance or density)?
- 5. Is there a budget for transport costs such as helicopter time or simply for transport to different inventory sites? In most Central American countries, most wetlands important to waterfowl are poorly accessible and it is not clear how a budget of only \$ 25,000 / winter will allow for adequate inventories of waterfowl and achieving conclusive results in all countries of Central America.

Answers

- 1. The project refers to all countries in Central America, i.e., Belize, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, and El Salvador. All countries must be covered annually to complete an annual census.
- 2. The contract price is the total available to do all the work associated with the census. It is up to you to determine the budget.
- All species of waterbirds must be recorded, but Canadian species are named in the Appendix 1 below.
- 4. It is up to you to propose the methods to follow and the data that will result. Refer to other censuses of waterbirds.
- 5. The contract price is the total available to do all the work associated with the census.
