Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.4 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. 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2.5 Applicable Laws

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

The bidder must offer products meeting all the technical specifications and components described in Appendix A. Bids will be evaluated on the mandatory technical requirements of Appendix C.

The bidder must clearly demonstrate how the products offered meet all the mandatory technical criteria in Appendix C. The mere mention that it meets the criteria is not enough. The bidder must provide sufficient detail to enable a full assessment.

Any proposal that does not clearly demonstrate compliance with each of the technical requirements listed in the table "Mandatory Technical Criteria" (Appendix C), will be considered non-responsive.

Only proposals that meet the mandatory criteria will be subject to financial evaluation. Bids that do not meet these conditions will be rejected.

APPENDIX A - REQUIREMENTS

1. Object

National Research Council of Canada (NRC) aims at exploring lab-scale hydrothermal treatment of various biomass sludge types (e.g.: lignocellulosic biomass in water, algal biomass in water, watery organic municipal solid wastes, organic sludges from various industries) to be integrated into pre and post processing steps of the Anaerobic Digestion process. Evaluating hydrothermal techniques to achieve: carbonization (T: 180-280°C), liquefaction (T: 280-374°C) or gasification (T>374°C) will require a device capable of fulfilling these conditions; from low temperature and pressure (ambient to 100°C) up to supercritical water conditions (above critical conditions of 374°C and 22MPa; up to a minimum of 500°C – 34MPa).

Within this mandate, the NRC wishes to purchase a lab scale pressure vessel apparatus (batch type reactor), with stirrer and controller (for P, T and rpm), that may operate under these conditions.

The apparatus (setup) should meet the specified requirements and delivered ready to use at the NRC address (6100 Royalmount Avenue, Montreal QC).

2. Constraints:

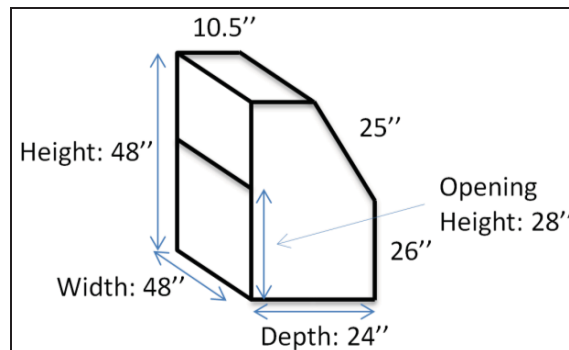


Figure 1: Regular chemical hood dimensions into which Pressure vessel will be installed

It should fit in a regular chemical hood of 48" width, 48" height (in the highest), 24" depth (Figure 1). As a result a benchtop reactor system is required.

In addition, since several connections are required with reactor's head, an apparatus (reactor) with fixed head and movable recipient would be preferred.

For safety reasons, a controller separated from the vessel is required to allow control of the reactor at a certain distance.

3. Mandatory technical specifications

The delivered equipment must have the following specifications:

- 3.1 Must have a maximum pressure of operation of ≥ 34 MPa
- 3.2 Must have a maximum temperature of operation of $\geq 500^{\circ}\text{C}$
- 3.3 Material of reactor (head and container-Receptacle) and inner parts-accessories must be Stainless steel T316 or more resistant alloy to corrosion
- 3.4 Must have gasket (included) for head and container close contact, which is adapted to maximum pressure and temperature of operation
- 3.5 Must have a head that must include:

- 3.5.1 Head must have 1 pressure relief device rated to the maximum pressure of operation
- 3.5.2 Head must have 1 pressure gauge that covers pressure range from 0 to maximum pressure of operation
- 3.5.3 Head must have 1 magnetic drive with torque ≥ 1.7 Nm (15in-lbs) and stir shaft-turbine impeller included
- 3.5.4 Head must have 1 gas exit valve
- 3.5.5 Head must have 1 liquid sampling valve (with tubing in reactor, from head to the vessel's bottom, that may also be used for a gas inlet)
- 3.5.6 Head must have 1 thermocouple connection with thermocouple included and adapted to reactor's operating conditions
- 3.5.7 Head must have 2 ports for cooling coil (refer to 3.6)
- 3.6 Must have cooling coil included (refer to 3.5.7)
- 3.7 Must have a container-Receptacle with inner volume of 500ml to 1000ml
- 3.8 Must have a heating mantle, 115-125Volts and ≥ 1400 W
- 3.9 Must have a variable speed stirring motor of $\geq 1/8$ hp
- 3.10 Must have 1 reactor controller:
 - 3.10.1 Reactor controller must have 1 PID (proportional-integral-derivative controller), temperature programmable for ramp and soak
 - 3.10.2 Reactor controller must have stirrer speed adjustment of 0-600rpm minimum
- 3.11 Must comply with laws and codes required for the use of laboratory pressure vessel (for the specific reactor volume) in Canadian territory, Montreal City, Quebec province.

4. Deliverables

- Technical documentation: The pressure vessel setup must include at least one operating manual in English and/or French upon delivery.
- The company must provide a detailed list in English and/or French of each components of the system

1.0 Evaluation method

1.1 To be compliant, a proposal must meet every mandatory requirements stated in the request for bids.

1.2 Proposals that do not meet the mandatory requirements (Appendix A 3.1 to 3.11) will be automatically rejected without any further consideration.

2.0 Financial evaluation

The lowest compliant proposal will be recommended for the contract award.

Labscale batch type pressure vessel with heating control and monitor for temperature and pressure.
