ITEM 1

PART 3 - OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

Bidder question received:

Is it critical to have the type A and Type B tenders submitted as two, completely separate bids? For example only, for the 1.5nm tender, could one submit a single tender that complies with both type A and type B or would it be mandatory to submit 1 x tender for the type A and 1 x for the type B separately?

Answer:

In Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions, Offer Preparation Instructions, section 1, it is required that *"Offerors may bid on one or more of the nautical mile categories, but must submit a complete Technical Offer for each."*

While understanding that lanterns are bid separately for each usage type (1.5 nm type A, 1.5 nm type B, 2 nm type A, etc.), it may be simpler to have one document for a specific lantern. A disadvantage might be an increased complexity of tracking bid evaluation components. Advantages might include:

- Offeror's bid packages may be less prone to error as common elements for a lantern do not have to be duplicated in separate documents.
- Bid evaluation is simplified as common elements are evaluated only once.

To directly answer the question, NO, it is not critical that type A, and Type B tenders be submitted as two, completely separate bids. The requirement is now changed such that common elements need only be submitted once per model (unique configuration) of lantern, and elements differentiating usage types are submitted for each model of lantern for every type bid.

Offer Preparation Instructions (Revised)

Canada requests that offerors provide their offer in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Offer (2 hard copies and 1 soft copy on USB media stick)

Offerors may bid on one or more usage types and must submit a complete Technical Offer for each. An offer for a unique model of lantern is made up of one set of common elements and one or more separate sets of unique elements. A lantern bid for more than one usage type thus requires one package of common elements and packages of unique element for each usage type bid.

The common elements are all elements from the Statement of Work and the following sections from the performance specification:

- 3.1 General
- 3.2 Optical performance
- 3.3.4 Battery
- 3.4 Protection and control
- 3.5 Environment
- 3.6 Service life
- 3.7 Preventive maintenance requirements

The unique elements are the following sections from the performance specification:

- 3.3.1 Power requirements (autonomy)
- 3.3.2 Permitted adaptation for limited insolation
- 3.3.3 Lantern autonomy

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Example format:

Product (****) offered for categories 1A, 1B and 2A.

Technical Offer:

Part 1: Common specifications for the product (****);
Part 2: Unique specifications for the product (****) usage type 1A;
Part 3: Unique specifications for the product (****) usage type 1B;
Part 4: Unique specifications for the product (****) usage type 2A.

NOTE: Suppliers are reminded that all categories (1A, 1B, 2A, etc.) are still evaluated separately as the 12 unique combinations of requirements remain the same. Submit all specifications and information required to fully demonstrate technical compliance of the product in each category usage type.

**Section II: Financial Offer, including Certifications
(1 hard copy and 1 soft copy on USB media stick)**

Offerors may bid on one or more of the nautical mile categories, but must submit a complete Financial Offer in accordance with RFSO instructions.

Answer:

No. There is no minimum call-up amount.
