ADVANCE CONTRACT AWARD NOTICE (ACAN)

1. Advance Contract Award Notice (ACAN)

An ACAN is a public notice indicating to the supplier community that a department or agency intends to award a contract for goods, services or construction to a pre-identified supplier, thereby allowing other suppliers to signal their interest in bidding, by submitting a statement of capabilities. If no supplier submits a statement of capabilities that meets the requirements set out in the ACAN, on or before the closing date stated in the ACAN, the contracting officer may then proceed with the award to the pre-identified supplier.

2. Definition of Requirements

The department of Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) has a requirement for a vendor to provide specific strategic dialogue on key priorities and issues through conference calls, custom on-site briefings/speaking engagements and consultations as follows:

- a) Brief the Minister's office on the latest in-house research and analysis on the Canadian Oil Sands and the significant opportunities presented to Canada through exports and transport via a new major pipeline carrying product to tidewater.

Any interested supplier must demonstrate by way of a statement of capabilities that it meets the following requirements:

The provider must:

1. Have in-house analytical team with dedicated expertise on Canada-US relations, strong knowledge of politics, economy, culture, language, social issues and industry sectors as demonstrated by at least a minimum of 7 years of experience in all of the above.

- 2. Have demonstrable expertise on trade and fiscal policy, as well as a network of relations with government officials in both countries, energy industry CEO's and executives and other relevant parties / industry insiders globally.
- Have at least 7 years of experience of experience related to policy, energy and natural resources, as well as sector-specific teams dedicated to energy and natural resources.
 - These team(s) must have experience in identifying regulatory and policy risks, particularly in the realms of carbon and environmental policy, and supply disruption issues, pipelines, oil prices, and supply and demand fundamentals in a North American context, as well as globally.
- 4. Have the ability and capacity to provide customized workshops related to the definition of requirements (above) and include its most senior staff, as well as in-house experts.
- 5. Be able to provide specialized geopolitical advisory services on energy and natural resources, including access to experts.
- 6. Be able to provide access to publications and reports (related to definition of requirements), demonstrated by such avenues as an online portal, and/or email distribution lists and/or publications and/or data bases.
