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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Statement of Work

Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members require hotel accommodations near McChord Air Force Base in Tacoma, Washington for Exercise Mobility Guardian. Personnel will arrive at McChord Air Force Base on 29 July 2017 and remain until 13 August 2017. Forty-five (45) members in total will require single occupancy rooms for fifteen (15) days.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2017-04-27) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) – Attn: Jason Amyot, jason.amyot@tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Former Public Servant

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts awarded to FPSs, bidders must provide the information required below before contract award. If the answer to the questions and, as applicable the information required have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with Canada's request and meet the requirement within the prescribed time frame will render the bid non-responsive.

Definitions

For the purposes of this clause, "former public servant" is any former member of a department as defined in the Financial Administration Act, R.S., 1985, c. F-11, a former member of the Canadian Armed Forces or a former member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. A former public servant may be:

- a. an individual;
- b. an individual who has incorporated;
- c. a partnership made of former public servants; or
- d. a sole proprietorship or entity where the affected individual has a controlling or major interest in the entity.

"lump sum payment period" means the period measured in weeks of salary, for which payment has been made to facilitate the transition to retirement or to other employment as a result of the implementation of various programs to reduce the size of the Public Service. The lump sum payment period does not include the period of severance pay, which is measured in a like manner.

"pension" means a pension or annual allowance paid under the Public Service Superannuation Act (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act, R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the Canadian Forces Superannuation Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the Defence Services Pension Continuation Act, 1970, c. D-3, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act, 1970, c. R-10, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the Canada Pension Plan Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

Former Public Servant in Receipt of a Pension

2.4 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.5 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid (1 hard copies)

Section II: Financial Bid (1 hard copies)

Section III: Certifications (1 hard copies)

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and

- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

3.1.1 Electronic Payment of Invoices – Bid

If you are willing to accept payment of invoices by Electronic Payment Instruments, complete Annex “X” Electronic Payment Instruments, to identify which ones are accepted.

If Annex “X” Electronic Payment Instruments is not completed, it will be considered as if Electronic Payment Instruments are not being accepted for payment of invoices.

Acceptance of Electronic Payment Instruments will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

Section III: Certifications

Bidders must submit the certifications and additional information required under Part 5.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Bidders are required to comply with all the mandatory criteria below to be considered responsive; a bid must meet all of the mandatory requirements of this bid solicitation. Bidders that submit proposals that are determined to be non-responsive will receive no further consideration.

Accommodations must include all services required at Annex A – Statement of Work.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

SACC Manual Clause [A0222T](#) (2014-06-26), Evaluation of Price – Canadian/Foreign Bidders

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

If there are no bidders able to provide all accommodations, multiple contracts will be awarded on a lowest bid basis.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

5.2 Certifications Precedent to Contract Award and Additional Information

The certifications and additional information listed below should be submitted with the bid, but may be submitted afterwards. If any of these required certifications or additional information is not completed and submitted as requested, the Contracting Authority will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to provide the certifications or the additional information listed below within the time frame provided will render the bid non-responsive.

5.2.1 Integrity Provisions – Required Documentation

5.2.2 Federal Contractors Program for Employment Equity - Bid Certification

Canada will have the right to declare a bid non-responsive if the Bidder, or any member of the Bidder if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, appears on the "FCP Limited Eligibility to Bid" list at the time of contract award.

Canada will not pay the Contractor for any design changes, modifications or interpretations of the Work unless they have been approved, in writing, by the Contracting Authority before their incorporation into the Work.

6.7.3 Method of payment – Single payment

Canada will pay the Contractor upon completion and delivery of the Work in accordance with the payment provisions of the Contract if:

Statement of Work

EXERCISE MOBILITY GUARDIAN 2017 Accommodation Services in Tacoma, Washington

1. OVERVIEW AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1.1. Background

- 1.1.1. 436 (Transport) Squadron will be participating in conjunction with several other nations and units in Mobility Guardian at McChord Air Force Base and will require hotel services for the duration of the event.
- 1.1.2. 436 (Transport) Squadron personnel in addition to several other members from 8 Wing units will arrive at McChord Air Force Base on 29 July 2017 and remain until 13 Aug 2017. 45 members in total will require rooms for 15 days.

1.2. Objective

- 1.2.1 The objective of this Statement of Work is to obtain hotel services in support of 436 (Transport) Squadron participation in Exercise Mobility Guardian 2017.

1.3. Scope

- 1.3.1 The Contractor is required to deliver the following services in support of the Sqn's participation in Mobility Guardian 2017;
 - a. Hotel services for no more than 45 people as indicated in the matrix at sec 2.2.1.
- 1.3.2 The general approach to the work described in this SOW is that the contract will be managed and administered by a single Prime Contractor who will either deliver all required services, or through sub-contracts, arrange for the delivery of the required services. In either scenario, the Prime Contractor will be wholly responsible for the seamless delivery of all of the required services and will proactively take the necessary measures to ensure that any conflicts or issues are promptly addressed and resolved. The Contractor must provide the services in the location identified in sec 2.2.1.

1.4. CAF Responsibilities

- 1.4.1 The CAF will provide a single Point of Contact (POC) to assist with booking requirements and changes.
- 1.4.2 The CAF Technical Authority (TA) will provide to the Contractor the exact/final number of rooms required no later than (NLT) 24 July 2017 and the remainder of rooms will be cancelled without penalty.
- 1.4.3 The CAF TA will inform the contractor no later than forty-eight (48) hours before check-in of any associated occupancy date cancellations or changes.
- 1.4.4 The CAF TA will be responsible to provide a list of the names of the personnel utilizing the accommodation at least 48 hours prior to the occupancy dates.

2. DETAILED TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

The requirements detailed below are the minimum requirements. The Contractor may provide alternatives that exceed these requirements.

2.1. Technical Requirement

- 2.1.1 Accommodations must be within a 5 miles (8 kilometers) distance of McChord Air Force Base (KTCM). Google Maps will be used to confirm distance.
- 2.1.2 All amenities must be segregated from the basic room rate.
- 2.1.3 General room cleaning service must be performed on a daily basis.
- 2.1.4 Fresh towel service and shampoo and soaps sufficient for the number of personnel in each room must be provided on a daily basis.
- 2.1.5 At least one (1) sanitized (clean or disinfected) glass drinking glass per person in the room must be provided.
- 2.1.6 Bedding exchange must occur on a weekly basis.
- 2.1.7 Rooms must be equipped double beds or larger with comfortable bedding. A sofa bed or cot will not be acceptable.
- 2.1.8 Private full bathroom with minimum of a toilet, sink and shower.
- 2.1.9 Rooms must be non-smoking.

- 2.1.10 Alarm Clock or easy access to a reliable wake-up call service.
- 2.1.11 At least two (2) electrical outlets.
- 2.1.12 In-room telephone capable of making international calls. Personnel will pay phone charges at time of check-out.
- 2.1.13 Rooms must have free internet (Wi-Fi) access throughout the common areas, including guest rooms.
- 2.1.14 Rooms must meet the local government's standards for hygiene and sanitation.
- 2.1.15 Space in vicinity of lobby with a table and 2 x chairs for support services.

2.2 General Requirements:

- 2.2.1 The CAF requires a provision of Hotel Services for rooms continuously for the dates indicated in the matrix below;

- 2.2.2. Personnel shall not be relocated to another room during their stay unless it becomes necessary as a result of a maintenance issue.
- 2.2.3 The hotel that is awarded the contract must provide early check-in and late check-out as required to accommodate flight times and/or changes. If not feasible, in lieu of early-in or late-check-out, a luggage storage area must be provided on request.

2.3 Contractor's Responsibilities:
