

CLARIFICATION REGARDING INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OWNERSHIP AND USE OF INFORMATION

While this is not legal advice and bidders are directed to their own legal counsel, the Copyright Act of Canada applies to all “works”, i.e. to all documents, irrespective of any literary merit. As such, the law is “automatic” in that someone must hold the Copyright, and in this case, it is Health Canada, legally known as: “Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada as represented by the Minister of Health”.

The above does not imply that Health Canada, as Copyright holder, will deny requests for permission to quote or copy the resulting report(s).
