PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

- 1. Before award of a contract, the following conditions must be met:
 - the Bidder's proposed individuals requiring access to classified or protected information, assets or sensitive work site(s) must meet the security requirements as indicated in Part 6 - Resulting Contract Clauses;
 - (b) the Bidder must provide the name of all individuals who will require access to classified or protected information, assets or sensitive work sites;
- 2. Bidders are reminded to obtain the required security clearance promptly. Any delay in the award of a contract to allow the successful bidder to obtain the required clearance will be at the entire discretion of the Contracting Authority.

1.2 Statement of Work

The Work to be performed is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4. Procurement Ombudsman

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the <u>Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual</u> (https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Revision to Departmental Name: As this solicitation is issued by Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), any reference to Public Works and Government Services Canada or PWGSC or its Minister contained in any term, condition or clause of this solicitation, including any individual SACC clauses incorporated by reference, will be interpreted as reference to RCMP or its Minister.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2016-04-04) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only by email to the address kaleigh.lafontaine@rcmp-grc.gc.ca by the date and time indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

Due to the nature of the bid solicitation, bids transmitted by facsimile to RCMP will not be accepted.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. 2.5 Optional Site Visit

Bidders are requested to communicate with the Contracting Authority no later than August 29, 2017 to confirm attendance and provide the name(s) of the person(s) who will attend. Bidders may be requested to sign an attendance sheet. Bidders who do not attend or do not send a representative will not be given an alternative appointment but they will not be precluded from submitting a bid. Any clarifications or changes to the bid solicitation resulting from the site visit will be included as an amendment to the bid solicitation.

2.6 Promotion of Direct Deposit Initiative

The following information is not related to the solicitation process:

An initiative within the Government of Canada called the Cheque Standardization Project has been established whereby eventually for all payments, cheque stubs will no longer be printed and, with few exceptions, will be processed via direct deposit. This option is only available when payment is made in Canadian dollars for deposit into a Canadian bank account. 4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.



PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS

Bidders must provide the required certifications and associated information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority may render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

D-3, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act, 1970, c. R-10, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the Canada Pension Plan Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

Canada may exercise this option at any time by sending a written notice to the Contractor at least 15 calendar days before the expiry date of the Contract. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority, and will be evidenced for administrative purposes only, through a contract amendment.

1. Title: Television Services

2. Purpose

To deliver standard definition (SD) television services to the Canadian Police College (CPC) residences and buildings.

3. Background

The CPC is a service delivery line of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP); providing advanced and specialized police sciences and executive training to Canadian and International police services and law enforcement agencies. The CPC is a recognized centre for professional education and development for its clients and partners in its role in supporting a safe and secure Canada.

The CPC provides most of its programming at its campus in Ottawa, Ontario. The campus includes residence accommodations and administrative buildings and offices for students and staff throughout several buildings. These buildings currently include telephone, internet, and television services. Each residence bedroom, and other specific areas are currently installed with satellite- and cable-ready television sets (Philips Hospitality LCD TV or LG Hospitality LCD TV).

The CPC currently uses a satellite television service, but each building is set up for either a satellite or cable television service infrastructure.

4. Objectives

The objectives of providing television service to the CPC are as follows:

- To provide a comfortable stay with basic amenities to its residents;
- To provide the essential services of any paid accommodations; and
- To remain competitive with other Canadian and international police colleges.

5. Scope of Work

- 5.1 The CPC requires television/satellite service to be delivered to the following buildings:
- "A" Building: (131 outlets)
- "C" Building: (2 outlets)
- "D" Building: (67 outlets)
- "R" Building: (1 outlet)
- 5.2 A programming package of at least 46 mainstream commercial television channels, provided to each room is required. This package will include at least two local Ottawa channels (one in each English & French); at least two news channels (one in each English & French), at least two sports channels (one in each English & French) and the rest an offering of mainstream entertainment and educational channels.
- 5.3 R Building has a coaxial infrastructure. Feeds to all other buildings come from/are localized from the mechanical room in Building A.

6. Other Requirements

- 6.1 The Contractor must show knowledge of and ability to address ANSI and ITU video standards.
- The Contractor must transfer ownership to the RCMP of all related equipment, at the end of contract, including for example, all satellite antennae, routers, switches, and cabling.
- 6.3 The Contractor must provide all maintenance for the equipment during the Contract period.

7. Technical Requirements

- 7.1 The system is to be free of design, manufacturing, installation and operating defects;
- 7.2 The system is to be designed and installed for ease of operation, maintenance and testing;
- 7.3 Distribution and other equipment must be labeled with the proper channel identification;
- 7.4 Terminating resistors (75 Ohm) must be used to terminate all unused equipment ports of the system;
- 7.5 All connectors must be compression fit connectors (no crimps);
- 7.6 All cables must be FT-4 or 6 rated, to meet the local building construction and electrical codes;
- 7.7 All cables must have a copper center conductor, foamed polyethylene dielectric, bonded APA laminated shield (Aluminum foil 100% coverage), 60% aluminum braid coverage;
- 7.8 Drawings of the system must be provided showing calculated signal levels;
- 7.9 Each antenna mast and IFL, if applicable, must be properly grounded with No. 6 AWG copper grounding wire, in compliance with the Canadian electrical code; and
- 7.10 The signal on each channel in each bedroom must show no perceptible signal degradation when compared to the Head-end/central building distribution point.
