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SI04 MANDATORY SITE VISIT

It is mandatory that the Bidder or a representative of the Bidder visit the work site. Arrangements have been made for the site visit to be held at the Glengarry Cairn Island on Lac St. Francis Ontario (42.122033,-74.490114) on Monday, October 2, 2017. The site visit will begin 1:00 PM EDT, the meeting location will be at the Raisin River Marine, 20347 Hwy 2, South Lancaster ON, K0C 2C0.

- In the event that the lowest compliant bid exceeds the amount of funding allocated for the Work
 - (a) by 15% or less, Canada, at its sole discretion, shall either
 - (i) Cancel the solicitation; or

Contractor Selection

Any contract resulting from this solicitation will be awarded to the responsive bidder whose total assessed bid price is the lowest. In order to be considered responsive, a bid must satisfy all mandatory terms, conditions, and specifications of this solicitation document. The total assessed

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bid price will be used for evaluation purposes only and will be calculated by reducing the total actual bid price by a percentage equal to the total number of points assigned through evaluation of the bid.

In this requirement Mohawks of Akwesasne opportunities Consideration will allow for up to a maximum of 10% downward adjustment to a proponent's price, for evaluation purposes only, in accordance with the following Bid Criteria.

Area of the Contract

Bidders are requested to maximize Mohawks of Akwesasne employment, subcontracting and onthe-job training opportunities, and involve Mohawks of Akwesasne and Mohawks of Akwesasne suppliers, in carrying out the work under this project.

Bids will be evaluated and allocated a range of points in accordance with the degree to which the Bidder's proposed method of carrying out the work meets the objectives of the following criteria:

Reporting

"Mohawks of Akwesasne supplier" means an entity which complies with the legal requirements to carry on a business in Akwesasne territories and which is a limited company that can demonstrate that more than 50% of the company's voting shares are beneficially owned and controlled by Mohawks of Akwesasne, or is a cooperative controlled by Mohawks of Akwesasne, or is a sole proprietorship or partnership of Mohawks of Akwesasne.

Evaluation and Assessment - Submission Requirements

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SUPPLEMENTARY CONDITIONS (SC)

SC01 INSURANCE TERMS

- 1) Insurance Contracts
 - a. The Contractor must, at the Contractor's expense, obtain and maintain insurance contracts in accordance with the requirements of the Certificate of Insurance. Coverage must be placed with an Insurer licensed to carry out business in Canada.
 - b. Compliance with the insurance requirements does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract. The Contractor is responsible for deciding if additional insurance coverage is necessary to fulfil its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. General

The insurance policies required on page 1 of the Certificate of Insurance must be in force and must include the insurance coverages listed under the corresponding type of insurance on this page.

The policies must insure the Contractor and must include Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada as represented by the Minister of Public Works and Government Services as an additional Insured.

The insurance policies must be endorsed to provide Canada with not less than thirty (30) days notice in writing in advance of a cancellation of insurance or any reduction in coverage.

Without increasing the limit of liability, the policies must protect all insured parties to the full extent of coverage provided. Further, the policies must apply to each Insured in the same manner and to the same extent as if a separate policy had been issued to each.

Commercial General Liability

The insurance coverage provided must not be substantially less than that provided by the latest edition of IBC Form 2100.

The policy must either include or be endorsed to include coverage for the following exposures or hazards if the Work is subject thereto:

- (a) Blasting.
- (b) Pile driving and caisson work.
- (c) Underpinning.
- (d) Removal or weakening of support of any structure or land whether such support be natural or otherwise if the work is performed by the insured contractor.

The policy must have the following minimum limits:

- (a) \$5,000,000 Each Occurrence Limit;
- (b) \$10,000,000 General Aggregate Limit per policy year if the policy contains a General Aggregate; and
- (c) \$5,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate Limit.

Umbrella or excess liability insurance may be used to achieve the required limits.

Builder's Risk / Installation Floater

The insurance coverage provided must not be less than that provided by the latest edition of IBC Forms 4042 and 4047.

The policy must permit use and occupancy of any of the projects, or any part thereof, where such use and occupancy is for the purposes for which a project is intended upon completion.

The policy may exclude or be endorsed to exclude coverage for loss or damage caused by asbestos, fungi or spores, cyber and terrorism.
