2.2 Submission of Bids

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 5 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

ANNEX "A"

STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT

Natural Resources Canada, The Canadian Forest Service, Atlantic Forestry Centre is a research facility that specializes in forest sciences. The research conducted includes diverse fields that include entomology, plant physiology, climate change, and land reclamation. An integral part of the research facilities are the greenhouse, growth chamber, and germinator facilities. We currently have two Conviron PGW36 walk-in growth chambers that are regularly used by our research staff. These chambers were manufactured by Conviron in November 1987. Though the units have been maintained in working order, spare parts for the controls have not been available since the 1990s. We believe that the unavailability of parts poses a risk to projects that rely on these units for delivery of research commitments.

Environmental Control System

At this time, we are seeking proposals to upgrade two units that would include; up to date environmental controls, power distribution and sensor input components. Upgrade components must be able to control temperature, humidity, and light intensity with tolerances as good as or exceeding that of the original specifications of the chambers.

Environmental controls **must**:

- Be user programmable from an integrated display screen.
- Have the ability to store at least 10 separate environmental programs.
- Have data logging and graphing ability for all of the sensory inputs and control functions.
- Have easily retrievable Logged data with the use of common data transfer methods such as Ethernet, SD card, USB, etc..
- Have visible and audible alarms for all controlled processes and monitored parameters. Alarm settings must be user programmable.
- Lock out feature to prevent unauthorized modification of control parameters (password or key).
- Have auxiliary contacts for connection of alarm outputs to a building management/monitoring system.
- Control temperatures within 0.5°C of the setpoint in the range of -10°C to +45°C and must include a temperature sensor.
- Control relative humidity within 3% by additive humidity up to 90% and must have a dry humidity sensor.
- Must meet CSA Standards or acceptable equivalent.
- Everything necessary for the upgrade must be provided as the installation will be done by a third party installer.

Carbon Dioxide additive system:

In order to increase the versatility of our germinators and growth chambers, we would like to have the ability to augment the carbon dioxide levels within the units. A single portable system with independent controller for the control of additive CO₂ would allow it to be easily moved from one chamber to another when needed.

The additive CO₂ system **must**:


