

Driver Services - CORCAN Industries Kingston – Reissue of a Bid Solicitation

This bid solicitation cancels and supersedes previous bid solicitation number 21120-18-2525294 dated Sept 12, 2017 with a closing of Oct 23, 2017 at 14:00 EDT. A debriefing or feedback session will be provided upon request to bidders/offerors/suppliers who bid on the previous solicitation.

This requirement is for: The Correctional Service of Canada, CORCAN Industries Kingston

Trade agreement: World Trade Organization Agreement on Government Procurement (WTO-AGP), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

Tendering procedures: Selective

Procurement Strategy: Limited tendering procedure

Set-aside under the Procurement Strategy for Aboriginal Business: This procurement is not subject to any set-asides for Aboriginal Suppliers.

Comprehensive Land Claim Agreement: This procurement is not subject to a Comprehensive Land Claims Agreement.

Security Requirements: This contract does not include security requirements.

Nature of Requirements: The following is a summary of the statement of work for this requirement.

CORCAN, a Special Operating Agency of the Correctional Service of Canada (CSC), requires a Contractor to provide drivers to operate CORCAN owned Tractor Trailers, Cargo Vans and Trucks for the shipment and delivery of CORCAN manufactured and refurbished goods to various locations in Ontario and Quebec. The Contractor must also provide assistance in customer services, as required. The term of the resulting contract shall be from contract award to 31 March 2018 with Canada having the irrevocable option to extend the Contract by 3 periods of one year up to 31 March 2021.
