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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Statement of Work

The Canadian Forces School of Search and Rescue (CFSSAR) has a requirement for accommodation services in Lake Louise, Alberta, Canada region to conduct their annual winter mountain operations training program. Accommodations will be required from 27 Feb 2018 to 19 Mar 2018, for approximately 256 room nights.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The [2003](#) (2017-04-27) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) – Attn: Jason Amyot, Jason.Amyot@tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Former Public Servant

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. In order to comply with Treasury Board policies and directives on contracts awarded to FPSs, bidders must provide the information required below before contract award. If the answer to the questions and, as applicable the information required have not been received by the time the evaluation of bids is completed, Canada will inform the Bidder of a time frame within which to provide the information. Failure to comply with Canada's request and meet the requirement within the prescribed time frame will render the bid non-responsive.

Definitions

For the purposes of this clause, "former public servant" is any former member of a department as defined in the [Financial Administration Act](#), R.S., 1985, c. F-11, a former member of the Canadian Armed Forces or a former member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. A former public servant may be:

- a. an individual;

- b. an individual who has incorporated;
- c. a partnership made of former public servants; or
- d. a sole proprietorship or entity where the affected individual has a controlling or major interest in the entity.

"lump sum payment period" means the period measured in weeks of salary, for which payment has been made to facilitate the transition to retirement or to other employment as a result of the implementation of various programs to reduce the size of the Public Service. The lump sum payment period does not include the period of severance pay, which is measured in a like manner.

"pension" means a pension or annual allowance paid under the Public Service Superannuation Act (PSSA), R.S., 1985, c. P-36, and any increases paid pursuant to the Supplementary Retirement Benefits Act, R.S., 1985, c. S-24 as it affects the PSSA. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the Canadian Forces Superannuation Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the Defence Services Pension Continuation Act, 1970, c. D-3, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act, 1970, c. R-10, and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the Canada Pension Plan Act, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

2.4 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.5 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Alberta.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

3.1.1 Electronic Payment of Invoices – Bid

If you are willing to accept payment of invoices by Electronic Payment Instruments, complete Annex "X" Electronic Payment Instruments, to identify which ones are accepted.

If Annex "X" Electronic Payment Instruments is not completed, it will be considered as if Electronic Payment Instruments are not being accepted for payment of invoices.

Acceptance of Electronic Payment Instruments will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Bidders are required to comply with all the mandatory criteria below to be considered responsive; a bid must meet all of the mandatory requirements of this bid solicitation. Bidders that submit proposals that are determined to be non-responsive will receive no further consideration.

Accommodations must include all services required at Annex A – Statement of Work.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

SACC Manual Clause [A0222T](#) (2014-06-26), Evaluation of Price – Canadian/Foreign Bidders

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest total estimated value (in Annex B- Basis of Payment) will be recommended for award of contract.

The proposed accommodations and meeting space must all be under one establishment.

The amount of guestrooms requested could vary based on the final requirement.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

5.1.1 Integrity Provisions - Declaration of Convicted Offences

ANNEX "A" – STATEMENT OF WORK

CFSSAR Winter Mountain Operations Accommodations

1. REQUIREMENT

The Canadian Forces School of Search and Rescue (CFSSAR) has a requirement for guestrooms in the Lake Louise, Alberta, Canada region to conduct their annual winter mountain operations training program.

2. SPECIFICATIONS

To provide Hotel accommodations that includes the following:

a. Guestrooms: The following is a breakdown requirement of the guestrooms required;

- i. single/double rooms as per Annex B,
- ii. all rooms will have a television with cable services,
- iii. each room shall have a dedicated washroom including shower/bath and toilet,
- iv. single occupancy guestrooms must have a double bed or larger. A sofa bed or folding bed will not be accepted,
- v. double occupancy guestrooms must have two double beds or two larger beds. A sofa bed or folding bed will not be accepted,
- vi. daily housekeeping,
- vii. all guestrooms must be non-smoking,
- viii. desk/workspace, and
- ix. included wireless internet,

b. Property: The establishment must meet the following minimum requirements;

- i. must have an onsite restaurant. (or continental breakfast) for morning meals;
- ii. must be located within a 5 kilometre radius of the intersection of Village Road and Lake Louise Drive in the village of Lake Louise,

- iii. all guests must be accommodated within the same facility,
 - iv. shall include sufficient parking for six large trucks/vans
 - v. shall have no less than four clothes washing machines and four clothes dryers, and
 - vi. shall have a separate instruction space such as conference room/board room for instruction of twenty staff and students from 0800hrs to 1600hrs daily with no need for computing/projection equipment. (CFSSAR will use its own computer equipment) (No food required).
- c. Room Cancellation Policy: In the event that travel plans are changed; participants may cancel up to 2 days prior to their arrival date without any cancellation fees. Canada will not be responsible to pay for any cancelled rooms.

3. CONSTRAINTS

- a. It is the Contractor's responsibility to establish a contingency plan for all accommodation bookings, at the same terms and conditions and rates, with other local hotels for an unexpected physical loss of occupancy due to unforeseen circumstances such as flood, mechanical failure, etc., and
- b. rates must not be subject to increase at any time, such as weekends, statutory holidays, events of a local nature such as area fairs. Blackout periods are not permitted.

4. CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- a. The Technical Authority named at the time of contract award will provide the rooming list the session dates.
- b. Reservations: Rooms will be reserved by a representative of CFSSAR. CFSSAR is responsible for payment of guestrooms by credit card. Additional expenses such as laundry fees, room service, long-distance call fees, etc. will be the participants' responsibility.
