PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) requires one (1) commercial, highway rated, triple-axle boat trailer (Galvanized Steel or Aluminum) which will be used to transport a 33ft long x 10' beam Landing Craft Vessel weighing 18,000lbs. The boat trailer must meet the specific requirements of Annex A.

The boat trailer must be received at the CCG Base in Prince Rupert, BC. CCG requests delivery of this requirement on or before March 31, 2018.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the *Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual* (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The 2003 (2017-04-27) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in British Columbia.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

- Section I: Technical Bid – One (1) hard copy;
- Section II: Financial Bid – One (1) hard copy;
- Section III: Certifications – One (1) hard copy.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid. Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should demonstrate their understanding of the requirements contained in the bid solicitation and explain how they will meet these requirements. Bidders should demonstrate their capability and describe their approach in a thorough, concise and clear manner for carrying out the work.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment. The total amount of Applicable Taxes must be shown separately.

4.2 Basis of Selection

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

ANNEX A

REQUIREMENT

1.0 OBJECTIVE:

The Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) requires one (1) commercial, highway rated, triple-axle boat trailer (Galvanized Steel or Aluminum) which will be used to transport a 33ft long x 10' beam Landing Craft Vessel weighing 18,000lbs. This vessel is stationed in Prince Rupert B.C. and assists with the ongoing lifecycle maintenance of Canadian Coast Guard Marine Civil Infrastructure in Northern B.C.

2.0 BACKGROUND

Canadian Coast Guard Lamproom in Prince Rupert B.C. requires a Triple-axle Boat Trailer to allow them to launch, retrieve and transport their 33' long x 10' wide Landing Craft. The trailer will give our crews the ability to perform regular maintenance to the vessel which is required in the Life Cycle Management.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

i. Required Services

The Supplier must deliver one (1) Triple-axle Boat Trailer as per the specifications listed below designed to carrying the Coast Guard Prince Rupert Landing Craft with the following:

1. Overall Length: 33'
2. Overall Width: 9'
3. Weight (with Full Fuel): 18,000 lbs
4. Hull Design: Deep "V"

ii. Specifications

The Triple-axle Boat Trailer must meet the following specification:

1. Triple-axle with 20,000 lb carry capacity, not including trailer weight.
2. Welded channel or beam frame construction fabricated out of aluminum or steel hot-dip galvanized.
3. Torsion axle suspension
4. Electrical over hydraulic braking system c/w cadmium plated disc brakes
5. 17.5" 8 lug aluminum or galvanized wheels
6. 17.5" special trailer tires with a rating of "H" or higher, (e.g. ST235/75R17.5H)
7. 10,000lb. side-wind style tongue jack
8. Adjustable 3,500lb. 2-speed manual winch with rope or strap
9. Bow-stop assembly
10. Minimum of 5 adjustable and pivoting plastic polymer covered bunks
11. "Walk-on" fenders over each wheel
12. 4 tie-down rings mounted to frame, 2 forward, 2 aft
13. 12 Volt LED water-tight sealed lighting conforming to BC Highway standards
14. Bow Access ladder

15. Two spare tire mounts attached to trailer frame carrying 17.5: wheel and tire as specified above
16. All Components are required to be corrosion resistant and suitable for the marine environment.
17. All hardware is to be galvanized or stainless steel. Galvanic corrosion protection to be used when dis-similar metals are in contact on all parts of the trailer.
18. Must be highway towable with Pintle style hitch, safety chain and hooks, screw jack stand, tail lights, and reflectors. Must be certified as per code and regulation requirements.

4.0 STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS

The Supplier must meet all applicable standards and regulations for triple-axle trailers.

5.0 DELIVERY
