PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The [2003](#) (2017-04-27) Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Manitoba.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Canada requests that Bidders provide their bid in separately bound sections as follows:

Section I: Technical Bid (2 hard copies)

Section II: Financial Bid (1 hard copy)

Section III: Certifications (1 hard copy)

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that Bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html) (<http://www.tpsgc-pwgsc.gc.ca/ecologisation-greening/achats-procurement/politique-policy-eng.html>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, Bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment.

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada and Bruce Haugh, Stantec Consulting Ltd, will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Bidder is requested to submit certifications, declarations and/or proof documents that substantiate information as part of their bid. If these documents are not provided at bid closing, the Contracting Authority will notify the Bidder that they have 2 business days to provide the requested documents. Failure to do so, and the Bidder will be deemed non-responsive and given no further consideration.

- (a) Bidder must demonstrate that it has been in business for a minimum of 3 (three) years as of the date of bid closing. At a minimum, the Bidder must provide:
 - 1. Copy of business name registration certification; or
 - 2. Copy of provincial or territorial business corporation registration certificate; or
 - 3. Copy of federal business incorporation registration certificate.

- (b) Bidder certifies that, should it be awarded a contract as a result of the bid solicitation, certified technicians will be available to perform the Work as detailed in Annex A, Requirement.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

B. COMPLIANCE MATRIX – Minimum Mandatory Performance Specification

A complete list of the mandatory performance specifications is detailed in the "Scope of Work" and "Compliance Matrix" under Annex A – Requirement. Bidders must review the Scope of Work in conjunction with the Compliance Matrix and provide the detailed documentation to support the specifications listed in the Compliance Matrix.

6. Failure to meet the minimum mandatory specifications will result in your proposal being deemed non-responsive, and be given no further consideration in the evaluation process.

2.	Each breathing air purifier must each include 40Ø (1-1/2") interconnecting piping, designed to CSAZ180.1-13.	
3.	Each breathing air purifier must each have electrical components prewired in a NEMA 4 electrical enclosure with numbered terminal strips, labelled electrical input terminals for 120/1/60 power supply. All electrical control panels must carry CSA special inspection certification for acceptance in all Canadian provinces.	

4.	Each breathing air purifier must have capacity to dry compressed air up to a maximum of 224 L/s (474 CFM) at 690 kPa (100 psig), to an atmospheric dew point of -40°C (-40°F), 1034 kPa (150 psi) maximum working pressure and maximum 37.8°C (100°F) saturated inlet air. Note: At 100 psig and 474 CFM is manufacturer's reference. At a system pressure of 120 psig, each air purifier must meet the required 398 CFM.	
5.	Each breathing air purifier must have an electrical supply of 120V, 1 PH, 60 HZ.	
6.	Each breathing air purifier must include desiccant chambers designed and manufactured to CSA B51 and ASME Section 8 Division 1, registered in the province of Manitoba, with 40Ø (1-1/2") inlet and outlet ports, separate desiccant fill and drain openings, including individual dual-scale chamber pressure gauge, pressure transmitter, and ASME certified safety valve.	
7.
