Amendment 002

This amendment 002 is raised to address questions and revise the solicitation.

Question 1: With respect to Articles 5.2.3 and 7.8.3 of the Bid Solicitation, and to Annex B (Technical Statement of Requirements):

We are trying to understand the full intent of your welding specifications. If the intent is for all welding to be done to the CWB Standards, then the only place to have any welding done will be in Canada, because it is exceptionally rare to have CWB Certified Welders anywhere else in the world. However, the AWS (American Welding Society) is well known and accepted worldwide.

If you were able to accept AWS for welding, it would allow all bidders to quote with certainty of their welding being accepted, which should allow for reduced costs, and better value for Canada.

Response 1:

Bidders may propose alternative equivalent welding standards to those listed in the Terms and Conditions of the solicitation documents. However, it is the responsibility of the Bidder to determine and demonstrate equivalency for each proposed alternative welding standard, for evaluation by Canada as detailed in the articles referenced below. Bidders must take into account the welding certification requirements described in Article 5.2.3 of the Bid Solicitation. Certifications will be evaluated by Canada as part of the formal Bid Evaluation process, and as indicated at Article 3.1.5 and Section 5 of the Bid Solicitation document.

It is important for the Bidder to take into account the following information included within the bid solicitation document:

- *Refer to Annex A (Technical Statement of Requirements), Section 3.3.2.1*
 - “3.3.2.1 The Contractor may propose alternative standards to CSA W47.2-11 (2015), Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification August 2017 to Canada. For each proposed alternative welding standard, the Contractor must demonstrate that the technical intent of CSA W47.2-11 (2015), Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification August 2017 is met. The demonstration of technical intent must be achieved by a compliance audit conducted by either (or both) the CCG and the Canadian Welding Bureau (CWB) before construction can commence.”

- *Refer to Article 5.2.3(4) of the Bid Solicitation (Welding Certification)*
 - The Bidder may propose alternative standards to CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification to Canada, August 2017. For each proposed alternative welding standard, the Bidder must demonstrate that the technical intent of CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 is met. The demonstration of technical intent must be achieved by a compliance audit conducted by either (or both) the Canadian Coast Guard and the CWB before contract award and within 21 calendar days of the written request by the Contracting Authority.

- *Please refer Article 7.8.3 of the Bid Solicitation (Resulting Contract Clauses - Welding Certification)*

The Contractor may propose alternative standards to CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification to Canada, August 2017. For each proposed alternative welding standard, the Contractor must demonstrate that the technical intent of CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 is met. The demonstration of technical intent must be achieved by a compliance audit conducted by either (or both) the Canadian Coast Guard and the CWB before contract award and within 21 calendar days of the written request by the Contracting Authority

The requirement remains unchanged.

Revision 1

Delete: Section 3.1 `Testing` in Annex A of the Statement of Work, in its entirety.

(Note that sections 3.1.1 and 3.1.2 of Annex A - Statement of Work, remain unchanged).

Insert:

“3.1 – Testing

The Contractor must demonstrate that each deliverable satisfies the requirements defined in the accompanying TSOR. Such demonstration of requirements must be conducted through the tests defined hereafter. At a minimum, these tests will confirm to the TA that each component, piece of equipment, sub-system, system, and the deliverables (together as a whole) can be operated to its full capacity while under design load operating conditions.

Testing must be conducted at the Contractor’s facility. Canada must be notified no less than two weeks prior to conducting testing.

Revision 2

Delete: Section 3.2 of Annex A (Statement of Work), in its entirety.

The Contractor must implement a quality management system that complies with the requirements of ISO 9001:2008 or ISO 9001:2015 – Quality Management Systems Requirements, published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). Only exclusions in accordance with clause 1.2 of ISO 9001 are acceptable.

Insert: The entity/entities performing the manufacturing and integration of the deliverables must implement a quality management system that complies with the requirements of ISO 9001:2008 or ISO 9001:2015 – Quality Management Systems Requirements, published by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). Only exclusions in accordance with clause 1.2 of ISO 9001 are acceptable.

Revision 3

Delete: Mandatory Criteria M22^{PB} in Annex 1 to Part 4 of the Bid Solicitation (Technical Bid Evaluation Plan), in its entirety.

Insert:

- a. Item - M22^{PB}
- b. Mandatory Criteria – The Quality Management System of the entity/entities performing the manufacturing and integration of the proposed product must comply with the requirements of: ISO 9001:2008 or ISO 9001:2015 - Quality Management Systems as specified in Annex A (Statement of Work).
- c. Evaluation Factor/Reference - SOW 3.2
- d. Evaluation - Verification of the entity's quality management systems with reference to the stipulated ISO 9001:2008 or ISO 9001:2015 standards.
- e. Method of Compliance - Description OR Certification*

* 'Certification' is the required method of compliance **only if** the entity/entities maintain the ISO 9001:2008 or ISO 9001:2015 - Quality Management Systems Certification”.

Revision 4

Delete: Mandatory Criteria M23^{PB} in Annex 1 to Part 4 of the Bid Solicitation (Technical Bid Evaluation Plan), in its entirety.

Insert:

- a. Item - M23PB
- b. Mandatory Criteria – The entity/entities performing the manufacturing and integration of the proposed product must have successfully* produced/manufactured HSS Systems for two (2) different customers with each contract containing the following terms:
 - (a) Deliveries made after January 1, 2008;
 - (b) Delivery of a minimum of 2 or more HSS Systems;
 - (c) Customer must be from one of the following categories:
 - (1) Oil and Gas Industry;
 - (2) Marine Spill Response Organization; or
 - (3) Government Department / Agency.

*met delivery and quality requirements as stipulated in the contract

- c. Evaluation Factor/Reference – Proven Experience
- d. Evaluation - Verification of the entity's recent experience conducting large-scale asset procurements with particular agencies.
- e. Method of Compliance - Invoice for each completed contract AND Quality Acceptance Letter for each completed contract

Revision 5

Delete: `Quality Acceptance Letter` in section 2.2 of the Technical Bid Evaluation Plan of Annex 1 to Part 4 of the Bid Solicitation, in its entirety.

Insert: The bid must provide a letter of reference from the customer who previously purchased produced goods from the entity which details, at a minimum, the delivery and quality acceptance of the goods in question. The letter must provide a brief description of the work performed, and time (month/year) at which the contract was awarded and completed. The letter must be produced on company letterhead, include a phone number and/or email address which can be used to contact the customer, and be signed by an authorized representative of the company.

Revision 6

Delete: 7.6.5 Travel and Living Expenses - No allowance for profit and overhead, of the RFP in its entirety.

The Contractor will be reimbursed for the authorized travel and living expenses reasonably and properly incurred in the performance of the Work, at cost, in accordance with Contract Cost Principles 1031-2, with no allowance for profit and/or administrative overhead. All payments are subject to government audit.

Insert: 7.6.5 Travel and Living Expenses - National Joint Council Travel Directive

The Contractor will be reimbursed its authorized travel and living expenses reasonably and properly incurred in the performance of the Work, at cost, without any allowance for profit and/or administrative overhead, in accordance with the meal, private vehicle and incidental expenses provided in Appendices B, C and D of the National Joint Council Travel Directive and with the other provisions of the directive referring to "travellers", rather than those referring to "employees".

All travel must have the prior authorization of the Contracting Authority.

All payments are subject to government audit.

Revision 7

Delete: Section 5.2.3 Welding Certification, of the RFP in its entirety.

Insert: Section 5.2.3 Welding Certification

1. The resulting contract requires that any entity/entities performing welding:
 - a. Are certified by the Canadian Welding Bureau (CWB) to Canadian Standards Association (CSA) W47.2-11 (R2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminium (or equivalent); and
 - b. All specified welds conform to the pertinent requirements defined in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 (refer to Appendix 1 of Annex B (Technical Statement of Requirements)) (or equivalent).

2. Welding must be performed using weld procedures and welders qualified by the CWB in accordance with the requirements of CSA W47.2-11 (R2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminium (or equivalent).

3. Before contract award and within 21 calendar days of the written request by the Contracting Authority, the successful Bidder must submit evidence demonstrating certification of the entity performing welding by CWB in accordance with the CSA welding standards .

4. The Bidder may propose alternative standards to CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification to Canada, August 2017. For each proposed alternative welding standard, the Bidder must demonstrate that the technical intent of CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 is met. The demonstration of technical intent must be achieved by a compliance audit conducted by either (or both) the Canadian Coast Guard and the CWB before contract award and within 21 calendar days of the written request by the Contracting Authority.

Revision 8

Delete: Section 7.8.3 Welding Certification, of the RFP in its entirety.

Insert: Section 7.8.3 Welding Certification

1. Any entity/entities performing welding:

- a. Must be certified by the CWB to CSA W47.2-11 (R2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminium (or equivalent); and
- b. All specified welds conform to the pertinent requirements defined in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 (refer to Appendix 1 of Annex B (Technical Statement of Requirements)) (or equivalent).

2. In addition, welding must be done in accordance with the requirements of the applicable drawings and specifications.

3. Before the commencement of any fabrication work, and upon request from the Technical Authority, the Contractor must provide approved welding procedures and/or a list of welding personnel they intend to use in the performance of the Work. The list must identify the CWB welding procedure qualifications attained by each of the personnel listed and must be accompanied by a copy of each person's current CWB certification to CSA welding standards.

4. The Contractor may propose alternative standards to CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification to Canada, August 2017. For each proposed alternative welding standard, the Contractor must demonstrate that the technical intent of CSA W47.2-11 (2015) Division 1 or 2, Certification of Companies for Fusion Welding of Aluminum, and the standards referenced in CT-043-EQ-EG-001-E, CCG Welding Specification, August 2017 is met. The demonstration of technical intent must be achieved by a compliance audit conducted by either (or both) the Canadian Coast Guard and
