1) Questions and Answers:

Question 1:

Item V. Electrical system:

- Item 3
- Must be equipped with resettable thermal circuit breaker

Question:

- L.e.d. lights have low amp draw
- Will have min. (4) resettable circuit breaker
- Is this acceptable?
- Please confirm

Answer 1:

A 4 resettable breaker is not acceptable since the single pole breaker will draw the amperage required for this project, 15-20amps.

Question 2:

General question:

- Do we need to provide all inspection & tests results with bid?
- Please confirm

Answer 2:

No, the inspection and tests results are related to the work to perform, it is a contractual task.

Annex C Mandatory Evaluation Criteria details what should be provided with the bid.

Question 3:

Can you explain what the item "v" two red clearance lamps do? Are they facing the rear or the sides of the vehicle?

The red clearance lamps can only be mounted a maximum of 48" from each other since the specification requires a 48" wide arrangement.

Answer 3:

The light are facing rear.

If the load is projecting more or less than certain length the color of the light changes, if the RED is on it means the load is projected at the rear so the red lights will be on.

2) Paragraph 6.14 Packaging Requirement

The packaging of the replacement recovery light bar must meet the following:

- i. In preparation for shipping, each item must be prepared as per the following: D-LM-036/SF-000 and IAW the preservation and packaging effort as described in D-LM-008/SF-001, Level B; and
- ii. If the combined weight of one item and its associated packaging (referred to as a unit pack) exceeds fifty (50) pounds, the item must be crated in a wooden box IAW D-LM-036/SF-000, Para 14, and must be designed to be material handling equipment (forklift) compliant.
