The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to acquire the goods described under item #2 to #11 and under the same terms and conditions and at the prices stated in the Contract. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority for a minimum of 60 per amendment up to a maximum of 300 for item #2 and for a minimum of 50 per amendment up to a maximum of 200 for all amendments in total, and will be evidenced through a contract amendment.

A.4 OPTION QUANTITY - Identified as Items #2 to #11

The Contractor grants to Canada the irrevocable option to acquire the goods described under **items #2 to #11** and under the same terms and conditions and at the prices stated in the Contract. The option may only be exercised by the Contracting Authority for a minimum of **20 per** amendment up to a maximum of 300 for item #2 and for a minimum

of 25 per amendment up to a maximum of 200 **for items #3 to #11** for all amendments in total, and will be evidenced through a contract amendment.

QUESTIONS

Q1

Ref: 2.0 – 2.11 The modular frame system (MFS) will require an additional component to achieve the desired requirement of stand-alone load carriage platform. This additional component;

- a. Can be removed completely from the MFS
- b. Can be stowed away under the Sniper Ruck Sack (SRS)
- c. **MUST** be removed for usage with the Sniper Patrol Pack (SPP)
- d. Is this acceptable?

A1

The answers to each of the questions (a through d) is yes.

Q2

3.3.1 – TDP – Does the customer require a level 1 Line drawing?

A2

A level 1 drawing which contains sufficient information to describe the item should be sufficient for cataloguing purposes. The requirements can be discussed further at the contract award meeting.

Q3

Will the customer accept the samples with English only labels? The final contract award labels would be bilingual as requested.

A3

Yes for bid submission/evaluation we will accept English only labels.

The final design of labels including translations will be finalized and agreed to at the contract award meeting. The first pre-production sample submitted for approval must have labels that meet the technical specification.

Q4

Will the customer accept the samples with white labels? The final contract award labels would be subdued as requested.

A4

Yes for bid submission/evaluation we will accept white labels.

The final design of labels including font/colour will be finalized and agreed to at the contract award meeting. The first pre-production sample submitted for approval must have labels that meet the technical specification.

Q5

With respect to the drag bag; does the customer want handles in specific locations? Does the customer want MOLLE on both sides of the drag bag? If so please specify.

A5

Yes the following two types of handles are required:

1. Carry handles must be placed along the long edge of the drag bag located close to the center of balance to allow the stowed rifle to be carried. It must be possible to hide the carry handles so that they do not snag when the sniper is dragging the bag through rough terrain while stalking.
2. A sturdy loop must be stitched at the muzzle end of the drag bag. This loop will be used by the sniper to attach a lanyard via a carabiner to the drag bag. Once attached the sniper will be able to drag the bag behind him as he stalks into position. This loop must be reinforced to withstand the loads of dragging a heavy weapon as well as items that may be attached to the Pouch Attachment Ladder System (PALS) webbing over rough terrain.

On the top side of the drag bag you must have 3 rows of PALS compliant webbing which runs the length of the drag bag. This PALS webbing will be used to attach pouches to the drag bag.

The bottom side of the drag bag must be a durable fabric that resist abrasion and tearing from being dragged by a stalking sniper across rocks and rough terrain.

Q6

With respect to the drag bag; when the end user is ONLY using the drag bag to carry the weapon; how do they plan to attach the suppressor and butt stock pouch? Will these pouches be MOLLE'd onto the drag bag? If not please elaborate.

A6

The sniper will use the PALS compliant webbing described in question 5.

Q7

Will the end users want to carry skis and the M-72 at the same time? If so how do you envision this being loaded?

A7

This situation could occur and if it does the sniper will use bungee or accessory straps provided with the MPS to attach to the side and/or front of the pack.

Q8

2.1.19 What are the total dimensions of the IPE ensemble when compressed?

A8

The approximate dimensions of the IPE are 13 inches long x 9 inches deep x 9 inches wide.

2.4.1.3 – Lid – What specifically is the end user looking to secure?

The sniper may hook valuable equipment to the securing dummy cord to prevent it from getting lost. This could include keys, kestrel, GPS etc.

Q11

Vertical pouch – 2.4.3.3 – Will the end user require FR/Heat resistant materials?

A11

No

Vertical pouch – 2.4.3.4 – What are the dimensions of the removable butt?

A12

The pouch must have a volume of 20 liters and be at least 11 inches in length to allow for the carry of the removable butt stock.

Q14

Do these suppressors have covers? We will need information on the covers also.

A14

Canada uses a Manta cover which would add approximately .75 in. to the diameter of the suppressor when the cover is installed.

Q15

Can you please give the exact dimensions of the C-15 suppressor? Or if there are multiple models in service the exact models and dimensions of all.

A15

Canada uses a suppressor with the following physical dimensions:

1. Weight: 81 oz / 2.3 kgs
2. Length: 19.3 in / 49.0 cm
3. Diameter 3.0 in / 7.5 cm

Q16

We also need confirmation on the sizing of the vertical accessory pouches. Section 2.4.3.3. refers to a 15 liter pouch for a suppressor and Section 2.4.3.4 refers to a 20L pouch for a buttstock. These both sound far too large given the content they are intended for. Please confirm the sizing.

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A16

These pouches are to be designed so that the sniper can carry other gear which requires easy access outside the SPP. It is envisioned that these pouches will run almost the length of the SPP and be attached on the left and right sides of the SPP to balance the pack load on the snipers shoulders. These pouches are also identified as the primary storage location where the sniper would carry the suppressor or the buttstock should the rifle be broken down for carry. Overall the volume should be 15 and 20 liters respectively.
