Concern #1:

Since the so-called ICS Canada "standard" is required, for this proposal call in spite of the fact that our firm has taught ICS to the NEB, ECCC, CCG, USCG and TC, as well as to many industry clients, both in Canada, and in over 20 countries we still find we are excluded from bidding on this solicitation. Not due to my inability to perform the work, but instead, because of where I live (BC).

Concern #2:

Based on our review of this solicitation we find that we are unable to obtain a Fisheries and Oceans Canada contract that should be available to all eligible and qualified firms.

Response to Concerns #1 & #2:

Per section 7.0 Client Support of Annex A

"CCG will provide formal ICS Canada AAHJ instructor endorsement letters for all resources providing training services associated with the contact who meet ICS Canada Standards".

Bidders who currently do not have AAHJ/AHJ endorsement are invited to submit a bid. Should they be successful, CCG will provide the endorsement for each of the identified instructors. The experience instructing ICS Canada Standards or identified equivalents is being evaluated only in rated criteria, not mandatory, which do not exclude bidders who do not have this experience from submitting a bid

Concern #3:


In reviewing the RFP Annex A, Statement of Work, Fisheries and Oceans Canada clearly identifies that ICS Canada materials, instructors, processes, etcetera are prescribed for the training curriculum and believe that our company, and our partners, could bring a great value to the Canadian Coast Guard for the ICS training requirement but we have been expressly excluded by the discriminatory procurement requirement to use only ICS Canada materials.

Response to Concern #3:

Per: 6.0 Intellectual Property of course Materials

"As an Agency Having Jurisdiction (AAHJ) with ICS Canada, CCG will provide the contractor with training materials approved by ICS Canada"

Therefore the ability to submit a bid is not infringed upon by the ability/inability to provide course materials (including but not limited to text books, testing materials, scenario's) meeting the ICS Canada standards as the materials will be provided to the successful bidder by CCG.



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In addition to the responses:

The Canadian Coast Guard has most closely aligned itself with ICS Canada and, as an Agency Authority Having Jurisdiction (AAHJ), recognizes and adheres to ICS Canada standards for the purpose of Coast Guards implementation of ICS.

The Department welcomes bids from all training providers with experience in delivering a standardized ICS training curriculum.
