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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

For the Department of National Defence, supply, deliver and install three (3) portable sleep units (pod/capsule/box) in accordance with the specifications and requirements outlined in Annex A to 22 Wing North Bay.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the [Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual](https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) (<https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual>) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than five (5) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

It is mandatory that the items be technically compliant as per the specifications listed in Annex B, Basis of Payment.

4.1.2 Mandatory Financial Criteria

Any offer which fails to meet the following mandatory requirements will be deemed non-responsive and will receive no further consideration:

- a) Offers must not contain any alteration to the Pricing Basis other than the addition of the Offeror's unit prices.
- b) Pricing must be provided for all items and all pricing periods.
- c) Offers must not contain any condition or qualification placed upon the offer.
- d) Pricing must be firm in Canadian currency, excluding applicable taxes, and must not be indexed or tied to an escalation factor.

4.1.2.1 Financial Evaluation

The sum of the Bidders Firm Unit Price multiplied by the Quantity will be the Bidder's Evaluated Price.

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, Delivered Duty Paid, Canadian customs and excise tax included.

4.2 Basis of Selection

4.2.1 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ANNEX "A"

REQUIREMENT

BACKGROUND

1. The Fatigue Risk Management System (FRMS) for the RCAF has identified the requirement of mission-centric sleeping equipment. The 22 Wing FRMS council and Wing Flight Safety Officer confirm the need for dedicated and appropriate sleeping facilities in the David L. Pitcher building (DLP, Bldg 127, CFB North Bay). The current sleep facilities within the DLP are non-existent.

SCOPE

2. Sleep facilities are required in order for operations to continue safely and enable primary duties to be performed with to the highest standards. Further, sleep facilities enable operational flexibility for a surged operational tempo.

EQUIPMENT TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

3. Due to crew size and number of personnel requiring the ability to sleep, the sleep equipment must be able to support private use by up to three (3) personnel and be accessible 24/7.

4. The requirements of the sleep equipment have been researched by the FRMS council are in line with the mission-centric requirements of the RCAF FRMS program and the operational requirements of CADS operations:

- a. Accommodation - Personnel up to a minimum of 6'7" and up to a maximum of 300 lbs.
- b. Dimensions- Maximum Width 170cm x Length 260cm x Height 185cm.
- c. Noise Reducing – Must be able to dampen sound, however still allow for PA's to be heard.
- d. Light Reducing – Must allow for ceiling lights to be blocked out to allow for quality sleep.
- e. Hygiene – Must support easy cleaning with the use of common disinfecting cleaning solutions.
- f. Portable – Must be able to be relocated using minimal equipment.
- g. Transmission Free – Must not have RF-emitting functions to include Bluetooth. If these functions come pre-installed they must be able to be removed or physically disabled.
- h. Power – Must utilize standard CSA outlet 120V.
