### SI1 INTRODUCTION

1. Parks Canada Agency (PCA) intends to retain an individual consulting firm or joint venture to provide the professional services for the project as set out in this Request for Proposal (RFP).
2. This is a single phase selection process. The nature of the requirement and the anticipated limited number of response by the industry leads PCA to believe that this approach will not unduly force a large number of firms to expend an overall unreasonable amount of effort in response to PCA.
3. Proponents responding to this RFP are requested to submit a full and complete proposal. The proposal will cover not only the qualifications, experience and organization of the proposed Consultant Team, but also the detailed approach to the work, and the pricing and terms offered. A combination of the technical and price of services submissions will constitute the proposal.

### SI2 PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS

1. All instructions, general terms, conditions and clauses identified in the RFP by number, date and title, are hereby incorporated by reference into and form part of this solicitation and any resultant contract.

### **SC1 HEALTH AND SAFETY**

Health and Safety: For work in the Province of Alberta

#### **1. Health and Safety**

1.1 While working on federal lands, the consultant and his employees/subcontractors shall perform the work in accordance to the rules and regulations laid out in the Canada Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Regulations.

1.2 In conjunction with the federal OSH regulations, the consultant and his employees/subcontractors shall also comply with the provincial construction health and safety acts and regulations where applicable.

#### **2. Workers Compensation**

1. The recommended Proponent shall provide to the Contracting Authority prior to contract award:

a) a Premium Rate Statement – Alberta; and

b) a Workers Compensation Board letter of good standing, listing covered Directors, Principals, Proprietor(s) or Partners who will be or who are anticipated to be present on the work site(s).

2. The recommended Proponent shall deliver all of the above documents to the Contracting Authority on or before the date stated (usually 3-5 days after notification) by the Contracting Authority. Failure to comply will result in a breach of promise, at which time the Contracting Authority will be free to approach the next responsive Proponent.

### **AGREEMENT PARTICULARS**

The Agreement Particulars will be issued at time of award of contract and will identify the fee to be paid to the Consultant for the services determined in the Price Proposal Form.

### SRE 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

#### 1.1 Reference to the Selection Procedure

#### 1.2 Calculation of Total Score

### SRE 2 PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 2.1 Requirement for Proposal Format

The following proposal format information should be implemented when preparing the proposal.

- (1) electronic copy on a USB thumbdrive, CD or DVD
- Paper size should be - 216mm x 279mm (8.5" x 11")
- Minimum font size - 11 point Times or equal
- Minimum margins - 12 mm left, right, top, and bottom
- Double-sided submissions are preferred
- One (1) 'page' means one side of a 216mm x 279mm (8.5" x 11") sheet of paper
- 279mm x 432 mm (11" x 17") fold-out sheets for spreadsheets, organization charts etc. will be counted as two pages.
- The order of the proposals should follow the order established in the Request for Proposal SRE section

#### 2.2 Specific Requirements for Proposal Format

The maximum number of pages (including text and graphics) to be submitted for the Rated Requirements under SRE 3.2 is thirty (30) pages.

##### **3.1.1 Licensing, Certification or Authorization**

The proponent shall be a Project Manager - Civil Engineer, licensed, or eligible to be licensed, certified or otherwise authorized to provide the necessary professional services to the full extent that may be required by provincial or territorial law in the province of Alberta.

##### **3.1.2 Consultant Team Identification**

The consultant team to be identified must include the following:

- a) Proponent (prime consultant)
  - Project Manager – Civil Engineer
- b) Key Sub-consultants / Specialists
  - Landscape Architect
  - Geotechnical Engineer
  - Registered Professional Biologist

If the proponent proposes to provide multidisciplinary services that might normally be provided by a sub-consultant, this should be indicated here.

Information required - name of firm, key personnel to be assigned to the project. For the prime consultant indicate current license and/or how you intend to meet the provincial or territorial licensing requirements. In the case of a joint venture identify the existing or proposed legal form of the joint venture (refer to R1410T General Instructions to Proponents, G19 Limitation of submissions).

## 3.2 RATED REQUIREMENTS

### 3.2.1 Achievements of Proponent on Projects (Maximum possible points – 20)

Select a **maximum** of 3 projects undertaken within the last 5 years. Joint venture submissions are not to exceed the maximum number of projects. Only the first 3 projects listed in sequence will receive consideration and any others will receive none as though not included.

- brief project description and intent. Narratives should include a discussion of design philosophy / approach to meet the intent, design challenges and resolutions.
- budget control and management - i.e. contract price & final construction cost - explain variation
- project schedule control and management - i.e. initial schedule and revised schedule - explain variation
- client references - name, address, phone and fax of client contact at working level - references may be checked
- names of key personnel responsible for project delivery
- awards received

The Proponent (as defined in R1410T General Instructions to Proponents, G12 Definitions) must possess the knowledge on the above projects. Past project experience from entities other than the Proponent will not be considered in the evaluation unless these entities form part of a joint venture Proponent.

### **3.2.2 Achievements of Key Personnel on Projects** (Maximum possible points – 25)

### **3.2.3 Understanding of the Project** (Maximum possible points – 15)

The proponent should demonstrate understanding of the goals of the project, the functional/technical requirements, the constraints and the issues that will shape the end product.

Information that should be supplied:

- The functional and technical requirements
- Broader goals (federal image, sustainable development, sensitivities)
- The relationship between this commission and any earlier studies completed for PWGSC or PCA
- Significant issues, challenges and constraints
- Project schedule and cost. Review schedule and cost information and assess risk management elements that may affect the project
- The Client User's philosophies and values

### **3.2.4 Scope of Services** (Maximum possible points – 15)

The proponent should demonstrate capability to perform the services and meet project challenges and to provide a plan of action.

Information that should be supplied:

- Scope of Services - detailed list of services
- Work Plan - detailed breakdown of work tasks and deliverables
- Project schedule - proposed major milestone schedule
- Risk management strategy

### **3.2.5 Management of Services** (Maximum possible points – 20)

The Proponent should describe how he /she proposes to perform the services and meet the constraints; how the services will be managed to ensure continuing and consistent control as well as production and

communication efficiency; how the team will be organized and how it will fit in the existing structure of the firms; to describe how the team will be managed. The proponent is also to identify sub-consultant disciplines and specialists required to complete the consultant team.

If the Proponent proposes to provide multi-disciplinary services which might otherwise be performed by a sub-consultant, this should be reflected here.

Information that should be supplied:

- Confirm the makeup of the full project team including the names of the consultant sub-consultants and specialists personnel and their role on the project.
- Organization chart with position titles and names (Consultant team). Joint Venture business plan, team structure and responsibilities, if applicable
- What back-up will be committed
- Profiles of the key positions (specific assignments and responsibilities)
- Outline of an action plan of the services with implementation strategies and sequence of main activities
- Reporting relationships
- Communication strategies
- Response time: demonstrate how the response time requirements will be met

To be considered further, proponents **must** achieve a minimum Technical Rating of fifty seven (57) points out of the ninety five (95) points available as specified above.

**No further consideration will be given to proponents not achieving the pass mark of fifty seven (57) points.**

#### **SRE 4 PRICE OF SERVICES**

All price proposal envelopes corresponding to responsive proposals which have achieved the pass mark of fifty seven (57) points will be opened upon completion of the technical evaluation. An average price is determined by adding all the price proposals together and dividing the total by the number of price proposals being opened.

All price proposal envelopes corresponding to responsive proposals which have achieved an overall pass mark of sixty per cent (60%) (fifty seven (57) points) will be opened upon completion of the technical evaluation.

To establish the Price Rating, each responsive bid will be prorated against the lowest evaluated price and the ratio of 40%.

The Price Rating is equal to the applicable percentage to establish the Price Score.
