ATTACHMENT 1 TO ANNEX A EVALUATION CRITERIA

The bid must meet the mandatory technical criteria specified below. The Bidder must provide the necessary documentation to support compliance with this requirement.

Bidders are advised that only listing information without providing any supporting data to describe responsibilities and relevance to the requirements, or reusing the same wording as the Request for Proposal (RFP), will not be considered "demonstrated" for the purposes of this evaluation.

Bids that fail to meet the mandatory technical criteria will be declared non-responsive. Each mandatory technical criterion should be addressed separately.

Mandatory requirements are evaluated on a simple pass or fail basis. Failure by a Bidder to meet any one of the mandatory requirements will render the Bidder's proposal non-responsive. The treatment of mandatory requirements in any procurement process is absolute. Each mandatory technical criterion should be addressed separately.

For each investigation summary provided, Bidders are required to provide specific dates (month and year) of experience as well as the total duration of investigation (number of months). Unless otherwise stated, the month(s) of experience listed for an investigation whose timeframe overlaps that of another referenced investigation will only be counted once. For example: Investigation 1 timeframe is July 2001 to December 2001; Investigation 2 timeframe is October 2001 to January 2002; the total months of experience for these two investigation references are seven (7) months.

The specific information that demonstrates the requested criteria should be included in the grid. The reference to the page and investigation number should also be provided so that the evaluator can verify this information.

The Mandatory Criteria and the templates for responding to these requirements are located below. In responding to each respective Mandatory Criterion, the Bidder must demonstrate that the firm is capable of delivering the services as described in Annex A – Statement of Work.

When a maximum number of investigations or pages are indicated, only the number indicated will be scored if the Bidder provides more than requested. Investigations will be scored in the order in which they appear in the proposal.

The total maximum mark for the rated requirements is 100 points. To be considered responsive, Bidders must achieve a minimum pass mark of seventy (70%) percent or a minimum of 70 points. Only bids that obtain the minimum pass mark will be considered responsive.

Each point-rated technical criterion should be addressed separately. Bidders are required to utilize the unique number identified with each rated requirement and the associated title in responding to the rated requirements.

The Bidder must provide sufficient detail to clearly demonstrate how they meet each rated requirement below. Bidders are advised that only listing experience without providing any supporting data and information to describe responsibilities, duties and relevance to the requirements, or reusing the same wording as the RFP, will not be considered "demonstrated" for the purpose of this evaluation.
