2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated in the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation*

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 5 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

***Bidders are strongly encouraged to request clarifications on acceptable equivalencies no later than five (5) calendar days before bid closing.**

2.4 Applicable Laws

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

ANNEX "A" - REQUIREMENT

1. Title: Combat Engineer Survey Capability Replacement

2. Background

In accordance with the Strong Secure Engaged (SSE) policy the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) is mandated to maintain levels of technological superiority, flexibility and operational readiness that are not possible with our current survey capability. In particular the combat engineers are required to possess and deploy with a ruggedized survey capability to conduct construction tasks on operations across the spectrum of conflict.

This capability will enable technological superiority by providing data to support advanced geospatial planning tools. Flexibility by allowing joint operations with the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) who have already procured a more advanced survey capability, and operational readiness across the spectrum of conflict by supporting tasks like the construction of vehicle bridges in response to domestic disasters, or an austere military camp bed down in support of combat operations.

3. Objective

- a. To identify the locations of projects with the military grid reference system to an accuracy of 1 meter.
- b. To provide relative accuracy on site to margin of 10 centimetres.
- c. Built around an Electronic Total Station to enable one person long range measuring.
- d. Multiple measuring systems from manual optical to GPS enabled means.
- e. Compatible with Department of National Defence (DND) baseline systems and multimedia.

4. Combat Engineer Tasks to be achieved with this Capability

- a. Control of cut and fill heights, best done with an Electronic Total Station.
- b. Route design and construction.
- c. Horizontal control of bridge approaches, rough grade (ISO accom construction) either through automatic optical or digital levels.
- d. Survey and planning of military camps, protective works and support infrastructure.

5. Deliverables

An itemized breakdown of all deliverables is provided at Annex B, Basis of Payment.

6. Constraints

A. Deliverables must be compatible in form, fit, function and quality to Leica Geosystems offered products as identified at Annex B.

In the event where the proposed item(s) is an equivalent product, suppliers **MUST** submit the following in accordance with SACC B3000T:

1. Products that are equivalent in form, fit, function and quality to the item(s) specified in the bid solicitation will be considered where the Bidder:
 - a. designates the brand name, model and/or part number of the substitute product;
 - b. states that the substitute product is fully interchangeable with the item specified;
 - c. provides complete specifications and descriptive literature for each substitute product;
 - d. provides compliance statements that include technical specifics showing the substitute product meets all mandatory performance criteria that are specified in the bid solicitation; and
 - e. clearly identifies those areas in the specifications and **descriptive literature that support the substitute product's compliance with any mandatory performance criteria.**
 2. Products offered as equivalent in form, fit, function and quality will not be considered if:
 - a. the bid fails to provide all the information requested to allow the Contracting Authority to fully evaluate the equivalency of each substitute product; or
 - b. the substitute product fails to meet or exceed the mandatory performance criteria specified in the bid solicitation for that item.
 3. In conducting its evaluation of the bids, Canada may, but will have no obligation to, request bidders offering a substitute product to demonstrate, at the sole cost of bidders, that the substitute product is equivalent to the item specified in the bid solicitation.
