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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 5 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in **New Brunswick**.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Basis of Selection

6.12.1 SACC Manual clauses: D0018C Delivery, Inspection and Acceptance

Delivery trucks must be equipped with an unloading device which will permit unloading at sites with no hydraulic, stationary or other type of unloading facility.

When making deliveries, sufficient personnel must be provided to permit unloading of any type of vehicle without the assistance of federal government personnel.

At some sites, the delivery truck must be unloaded while parked at the curb. When material is placed on the sidewalk, it must be placed in proximity to the designated entrance so as to be readily accessible to transport by mechanical handling equipment utilized by site personnel.

Environment and Climate Change Canada, Toxicology Laboratory requires an incubator of sufficient size with a wide temperature range and the ability to control the on/off light cycle. The incubator will replace the current incubator used in amphibian research.

1. The incubator must fit through door opening that is 97x208cm (WxH).
2. The incubator must have internal dimensions of at least 78x152x68cm(WxHxD/F-B)
3. The incubator must have stainless steel interior of type 304 stainless steel or better.
4. The incubator must have a minimum of 4 solid stainless steel shelves that are removable and height adjustable. The shelves must support a weight up to 22.6Kg or more.
5. The incubator must have lights on the door with a 24 hour timer to control light/dark photoperiod (must be able to set what time the lights turn on and turn off) and the door must have an outside cover to prevent light from entering from outside the chamber.
6. The incubator must heat and cool with a temperature range of at least 0°C to 60°C, which can be set in 0.1°C increments and maintain temperature uniformity of $\pm 0.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ or less within the chamber. Must be able to maintain a temperature of 3°C for 8 weeks.
7. The incubator must run on 120V, 60Hz AC power.
8. The incubator must have floor which can support the weight of a large water tank up to 68Kg or more.
9. The incubator must have 120V receptacles inside the chamber to run electrical devices.
10. The incubator must have at least one access port to run cables.
11. The incubator must have casters for mobility and leveling feet.
