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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

This requirement is Unclassified and there is no security association with this requirement.

1.2 Statement of Work

The Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) contingent will require charter busses and cargo trucks services for up to 190 members in the vicinities of Lille Airport and Brussels Airport (France and Belgium) as well as Mons and surrounding areas (Belgium and France), for the period 4 to 14 November 2018, in support of OP Distinction.

Work to be performed is detailed under Annex A – Statement of Work, Appendix 1 and Appendix 2.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the bid solicitation by number, date and title are set out in the <u>Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual</u> (https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bidders who submit a bid agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the bid solicitation and accept the clauses and conditions of the resulting contract.

The <u>2003</u> 2018-05-22 Standard Instructions - Goods or Services - Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the bid solicitation.

2.2 Submission of Bids

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit

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the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario, Canada.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Larger bids may be submitted through more than one e-mail. DND will confirm receipt of documents. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to ensure that their entire bid submission has been received. Bidders must not assume that all documents have been received unless DND confirms receipt of each document. Due to the possibility of e-mail rejection and/or other technical issues, bidders are requested to allow sufficient time before the closing time and date to submit their bid and for DND to confirm receipt. Bid documents received after the closing time and date will not be accepted.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Section I: Technical Bid

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ANNEX "A" - STATEMENT OF WORK

1. Scope

1.1. Purpose

The Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) will conduct Op DISTINCTION events to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the End of the First World War in November 2018. The CAF contingent will require charter busses and cargo trucks services for up to 190 members in the vicinities of Lille Airport and Brussels Airport (France and Belgium) as well as Mons and surrounding areas (Belgium and France), for the period 4 to 14 November 2018.

2. Requirements

2.1. Tasks

The Contractor must provide charter bus and cargo transport services as detailed in the technical requirements. Locations for passenger pick-up and drop off are detailed in Appendix 1 and 2.

2.2. Technical Requirements

2.1 Chartered Bus Service

- 2.1.1 Capability to carry 190 CAF members.
- 2.1.2 Busses will be no more than five (5) years old and have no more than 500,000 kilometers on the odometer.
- 2.1.3 Busses will have a secure storage capability for carry-on luggage (5kg per passenger) and band equipment for thirty-five (35) musicians (instruments/baggage = 10m3 and 1100kg).
- 2.1.4 Busses will have functional air conditioning and interior heating systems with fans to circulate the cooled or heated air within the vehicle.
- 2.1.5 Busses will have a main passenger entry/exit door and emergency exits from the vehicle, in the event of a collision.
- 2.1.6 Busses will have functioning seat belts, for the driver and all passengers within the vehicle.
- 2.1.7 Busses will have a functioning lavatory (water closet) on board that is serviced daily for long hauls between events.

2.2 Cargo Transportation Services

2.2.1 Cargo trucks must be able to secure all baggage from theft at all times.

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- 2.2.2 Cargo trucks must be capable of transporting up to 280 x 25kg luggage pieces (7,000 kg and 42m3) and 60 x band equipment (455 kg and 18 m3) for a total capacity 7,455 kg and 60 cubic meters on 4-5 November 2018.
- 2.2.3 Cargo trucks must be capable of transporting up to 280 x 25kg luggage (7,000 kg and 42m3) and 60 x band equipment (455 kg and 18 m3) for a total capacity 7,455 kg and 60 cubic meters on 14 November 2018.
- 2.2.4 Cargo trucks must be no more than five (5) years old and have no more than 500,000 kilometers on the odometer.
- 2.2.5 Cargo trucks must have a solid box for the cargo hold area.
- 2.2.6 Cargo trucks must have functioning seat belts, for the driver and all passenger positions within the vehicle. One member of the CAF contingent will accompany the driver to provide directions whenever the truck is carrying baggage.

2.3 General Requirements for Busses and Cargo Vehicles

- 2.3.1. All busses and cargo trucks must include qualified drivers to operate for the duration of the schedules as detailed in Appendix 1 and 2.
- 2.3.2. The Contractor will be responsible to provide good quality service for all busses and cargo trucks including but not limited to:
 - a. Vehicle safety and cleanliness (vehicle to be cleaned of garbage and swept daily, toilets cleaned daily):
 - b. All busses and cargo trucks must meet all local Government Safety Standards;
 - Drivers must be courteous, professional and neat in appearance and manner: and
 - d. Drivers must be fluent in speaking French and/or English.
- 2.3.3. Bus drivers will be responsible to meet the schedule requests of the CAF dispatchers. There will be a daily coordination meeting between bus drivers and a point of contact designated by the CAF in order to plan the day's activities and communicate any changes to schedule. Scheduling to be confirmed and will be provided via email to winning bidder no later than 02 November 2018.
- 2.3.4 As flight delays may be experienced, the buses must be prepared to drive and be standing by for up to four (4) hours at the designated airports during arrivals and departures as described in Appendix 1 and 2.
- 2.3.5 Flight arrival and departure timings will be confirmed no later than close of business on 02 November 2018. Before this date, the times may be moved up by 24 hours from the times originally specified.
- 2.3.6 The busses and cargo trucks services will be required for dates and locations as specified in Appendix 1 and 2.

2.4 CAF Responsibilities

2.4.1 Identify the CAF Technical Authority (TA) at the time of contract award and provide an updated schedule of locations and times when the services are required by close of business on 02 November 2018.

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- 2.4.2 The TA will designate a point of contact (POC) as onsite dispatcher who will speak directly with the Contractor as required. The contact information of the POC will be made available to the Contractor.
- 2.4.3 The TA will provide an updated schedule indicating exact timing and number of personnel to be transported at least eight (8) hours in advance of any changes to the schedule.
- 2.4.4 The TA will identify the location of suitable parking areas for buses during all events if required and coordinate access to all pick-up and drop-off location of personnel as required by event security and transportation managers.
- 2.4.5 The TA will meet and brief all drivers on 4 November 2018 at Brussels Airport and Lille Airport.

2.5 Contractor Responsibilities

- 2.5.1 The Contractor is responsible for the safe transportation of all CAF personnel and equipment to the various predetermined locations as indicated in Appendix 1 and 2.
- 2.5.2 The Contractor is responsible for the provision of busses and cargo vehicle(s) with qualified operators for all requirements. The Contractor is responsible to adhere to all required times and ensure that the passenger transportation solutions (busses) and cargo transportations means are ready and standing by at the required timings and locations.
- 2.5.3 The Contractor will provide the name of an individual who will act as the single Point of Contact (POC) for the CAF in addressing all technical and administrative matters.
- 2.5.4 Airport access, or access to any destination that has a security cordon, (TBC by the CAF TA) for all operators will be arranged by the CAF TA. The Contractor will provide (via email) requested information and documentation to the CAF TA no later than close of business on 02 November 2018.

Requested information for operator to gain access to airport grounds:

- a. Drivers Licence;
- b. Passport; and
- c. Vehicle type (make, model, vehicle registration and proof of insurance.
- 2.5.5 The Contractor must ensure that operators have appropriate licensing and qualifications to operate the vehicles on the airport grounds and commercial roadways to which they are charged with operating.
- 2.5.6 The Contractor must ensure that the bus drivers meet with the CAF TA to receive a briefing regarding pickup timings, locations, all required duties and to review the Statement of Work (SOW) equipment serviceability requirements two (2) hours prior to flight arrival 4 November 2018 at the Brussels and/or Lille airports.

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- 2.5.7 The Contractor must ensure that vehicle operators are fed and lodged at the Contractor's expense within thirty (30) minutes of Mons, Belgium, and no more than forty-five (45) minutes from Valenciennes, France, to facilitate operations.
- 2.5.8 The Contractor must ensure that vehicle operators are reachable by cellular phones at all times and their phone numbers must be provided to the CAF TA by 2 November 2018 to facilitate local coordination.
- 2.5.9 The Contractor is responsible for all normal operating costs or expenses related to the following but not limited to:
 - a. All vehicle maintenance and damages;
 - b. Vehicle insurance:
 - c. Traffic violations;
 - d. Fuel:
 - e. Permits;
 - f. Recovery charges;
 - g. Road tolls and administration fees;
 - h. Parking and access fees;
 - All living expenses i.e. food, lodgings etc. of the drivers and any other staff;
 - j. Oil and lubricants; and
 - k. Replacement of tires.
- 2.5.10 The Contractor is responsible for all vehicle maintenance and must provide replacement vehicles within four (4) hours of breakdown when a vehicle is taken out of service for repairs or maintenance. The replacement vehicle must adhere to all requirements outlined in paras 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3 of this document.
- 2.5.11 The Contractor must be flexible and accommodate minor schedule changes, additions and deletions to the schedule up to eight (8) hrs in advance of the requirement as communicated by the TA.
- 2.5.12 Operators must remain at destination locations during events unless directed otherwise by the TA.
- 2.5.13 The Contractor must provide either a French or English speaking point of contact to be available on a 24/7 basis. The POC must possess the authority to act and or decide on all matters concerning the fulfillment of the duties described in this document.
