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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

2.2 Submission of Bids

Bids must be submitted only to Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) Bid Receiving Unit by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the bid solicitation.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Financial Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Bidders must submit pricing in accordance with Annex B, Basis of Payment in Canadian Funds. Pricing must be provided for all line items.

4.1.1.2 The evaluated price is the aggregate of the extended prices at Annex B – Basis of Payment, calculated as Quantity multiplied by Firm Unit Price offered by the bidder, for the firm and optional requirements.

4.2 Basis of Selection

A bid must comply with all requirements of the bid solicitation to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

ANNEX "A"

REQUIREMENT

1. Introduction

Indigenous Services Canada (ISC), First Nations and Inuit Health Branch (FNIHB), Ontario Region provides health care services directly to First Nations communities located in remote and isolated in Northern Ontario. The services are provided through 23 nursing stations. Most of these locations are accessed by air, water, or winter road. At these nursing stations services are primarily provided by nurses with support from the provincially funded physicians and other allied health care providers.

The Branch has noted increasing trend in births in communities. With an annual birth rate of about 25 births in some communities. In some instances there were two in-station deliveries in one month alone.

A newborn baby experiences unstable temperature after delivery. The temperature of mother's womb is higher than the air temperature of the delivery room. It is vital to prevent the fall in infant's temperature as it can even increase the mortality risk.

It is necessary to provide immediate infant warming right after delivery as a baby has four times bigger capacity to loss of heat than a grown-up. If a newborn baby loses heat rapidly, it leads to a phenomenon called 'cold stress'. Oxygen consumption and metabolism increase, and this can even lead to hypoxia. Powerful, safe, and controlled radiant warming reduces cold stress and prevents the baby from further negative effects.

2. Objective

The objective of this contract is to purchase Basic Baby Warmers in order to ensure safe and effective care for newborns who are delivered at nursing stations.

3. Background

Indigenous Services Canada, First Nations and Inuit Health Branch, Ontario Region has the mandate of providing health care services to the remote and isolated First Nations communities on reserve. The department provide urgent, emergent, and primary care services provided by registered nurses with the support of physicians. The patients who require admission and further treatment will be transferred to provincially funded hospitals in urban centres. Patient transportation from nursing stations to the higher level of care hospitals is the responsibility of air ambulance through the province of Ontario.

Prenatal patients are cared for in the community on out-patient basis and transferred out for "confinement" when nearing delivery to a facility that has capacity for labour and delivery. In some cases, the patients do not go out for confinement in time for delivery and or goes into preterm labour. Nursing station are then required to assist with the delivery of the baby and meet the immediate care needs for both the mother and the baby.

Due to inclement weather and or distance, it may take hours or even days for transport team to arrive to pick up the baby and the mother. Therefore, there is a need to stabilize and care for newborns while awaiting transfer to higher level of care. Consequently, there is a requirements to supply baby warming device to keep the infant warm while awaiting transfer.

4. Requirement

Mobile Baby Warmer as per the following:

- Mobile Basic Baby Warmer Unit to be used in the ambulatory clinical settings awaiting, including but not limited to the following:
 - o Microprocessor-controlled warming system;
 - o integrated APGAR timer;
 - o automatic pre-warm mode;
 - o manual and servo temperature control;
 - o pivoting warmer head;
 - o softbed mattress;
 - o reusable dual thermistor skin temperature probes;
 - o examination light;
 - o ambient temperature sensing;
 - o steering castors;
 - o variable bed-tilt mechanism;
 - o instructions for use; and
 - o cart assembly.
- Must provide standard warranty; and
- Must provide electronic trouble shooting guide, cue cards and hard copy user manuals.

5. Contractor's Obligations

- Unless otherwise specified, the Contractor must use its own equipment and software for the performance of any work required;
- For each item of equipment that is purchased, the Contractor is to record the name, manufacturer, model number, serial number, optional equipment, supplier and price and forward this information to the Project Authority;
- The Contractor must label all equipment as being the property of Canada;
- To provide a temporary loaner, with the same specifications, if equipment goes out for repairs or maintenance; and
- To provide installation of units and to provide training to end-users at final destination of units, by March 31, 2019.

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8. Training

Training must be conducted in a manner that enable "train the trainer" knowledge and skill transfer in the practice settings. Hence the training must include: comprehensive demonstration and instructions in systems operation in all aspects of equipment operation, user maintenance, troubleshooting, and how to access support services of a trained application specialist. The contractor must provide an electronic or hard copy of the training manual and any reference material, in English, must be provided to each user.
