PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

There is no security requirement applicable to the Contract.

1.2 Requirement - Bid

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

Bids/Offers will be not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. This email is to initiate an ePost Connect conversation, as detailed in the Standard Instructions.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 5 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in **New Brunswick**.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

ANNEX "A" - REQUIREMENT

REQUIREMENT:

- 1.1 Purpose. Training aids and infrastructures are key in providing maximum instructional value to the students of CFSME, particularly with EOD, Mine Warfare and Search courses where students are introduced to numerous landmines, conventional munitions and improvised explosive devices. A set of a variety of inert landmines, conventional munitions and improvised explosive devices aimed at teaching the recognition, functionality and mechanisms of such devices would greatly benefit students in learning to identify, dispose or the report of such items.

- 1.2 Background. CFSME currently holds a large quantity of dummy ordnance that are used as training aids for the mine and conventional munition disposal courses. Many of these training aids are getting seriously old and worn-out from years of intensive training. The majority of these training aids display only the external features of common conventional munitions. CFSME requires an ordnance training set that includes instructional aids that demonstrate the major mechanisms commonly found in ordnance fuzing and requires a renewal of a variety of training aids that includes every possible type of these specific items manufactured worldwide in order to reflect the history and the actual threat that CAF could possibly encounter while conducting diverse operations. Landmines and unexploded conventional munitions have been unfortunately left behind from diverse conflicts and we need to train our Sappers accordingly as they are the specialists on the ground with regards to that type of threat.

- 1.3 Terminology. A list of the acronyms used in this document is as follows:
 - a. CFSME Canadian Forces School of Military Engineering;
 - b. FETS Field Engineer Training Squadron;
 - c. MWD Mines Warfare and Demolition;
 - d. EOD Explosive Ordnance Disposal;
 - e. SOR Statement of Requirement; and
 - f. TA Technical Authority.
 - g. SQ or SQMS Squadron Quartermaster / Stores

2.0 Requirements

2.1 Tasks. CFSME requires one complete fuze training kit that has been manufactured meeting the following criteria:

- a. Must contain at a minimum 10 fuzes that have mechanically functional parts with internal mechanisms that can:
 - i. Be set to the armed state with external cutaways to show the arming function;
 - ii. Be set to the firing state with external cutaways to show the firing function; and
 - iii. Be able to be reset to an unarmed state;
- b. Must be contained in a robust and rigid plastic shipping container of similar analogue to the commercial company "Pelican" to ensure the contents are delivered unharmed to even the most challenging field training locations;
- c. Aforementioned case must contain foam to ensure the contents are delivered unharmed to even the most challenging field training location; and
- d. Fuzes within the fuze training kit must share a commonality of color coding amongst components in order to identify and differentiate mechanisms from explosive components.

3.1.1 Technical Requirements. EOD Squadron requires that the following technical specifications be met or exceeded:

- a. Fuze training kit must contain a minimum quantity of 10 full scale fuzes to represent the following types:
 - i. Point-detonating with the following positive safeties:
 - (1) Bore riding pin;
 - (2) Safety slider / shutter;
 - (3) Detent balls and/or locking balls; and
 - (4) Vane arming with functional gear arming training with visible indicator for armed state;

- ii. Point-initiating, base-detonating with a functioning piezo-electric crystal to show electric current generator,
- iii. Pressure based fuzing to include landmine fuzing with inverted cone pressure fuze and/or Belleville Spring;
- iv. Time fuze including the following:
 - (1) Mechanical time to include a functioning cocked striker mechanism that can be reset; and
 - (2) A method in which a hung striker mechanism can be simulated;
- v. Booby trap switch (to mimic current in-service FIAI) that must be able to replicate the following setups:
 - (1) Tripwire;
 - (2) Pressure;
 - (3) Pressure release;
 - (4) Tension; and
 - (5) Tension release;
- vi. All way acting fuze with the following specification:
 - (1) Due to the complicated nature of this fuze this item must be able to simulate the spin release of the safety mechanisms and the alignment of the firing pin. This can either be accomplished via mechanical or electrical means or a combination thereof; and
- vii. Variable time with the following specifications:
 - (1) Must have live electrical components to simulate proximity hazard;
 - (2) Must be fitted with a sensor to provide signaling of disruption of proximity hazard; and
 - (3) Item must provide user with either audible or visual feedback that the proximity hazard area has been broken.

2.2 CFSME requires a diversity of actual past and present landmines who's been manufactured meeting the following criteria

a. Training aids must contain training aids that having functional parts with internal mechanisms that can:

- i. Be set to the armed state with to show the arming function;
- ii. Be set to the firing state with to show the firing function; and
- iii. Be able to be reset to an unarmed state.
- iv. Be able to cover the following setups:

- (1) Tripwire;
- (2) Pressure;
- (3) Pressure release;
- (4) Tension; and
- (5) Tension release.

3.0 Constraints. All munitions must be coloured in such a fashion that it is clear that they are inert and free of explosives and a detailed fiche must follow with the item to cover its own specifications.

4.0 Deliverables. Complete list of deliverables below as Appendix 1 to this Annex A. Training kits and all supporting equipment are to be delivered in full working order not later than **15 March 2019**
