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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.2 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.3 Trade Agreements

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), and the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

1.4 epost Connect service

This bid solicitation allows bidders to use the epost Connect service provided by Canada Post Corporation to transmit their bid electronically. Bidders must refer to Part 2 entitled Bidder Instructions, and Part 3 entitled Bid Preparation Instructions, of the bid solicitation, for further information.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 7 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory

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specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

PART 3 - BID PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

If the Bidder chooses to submit its bid electronically, Canada requests that the Bidder submits its bid in accordance with section 08 of the 2003 standard instructions. Bidders must provide their bid in a single transmission. The epost Connect service has the capacity to receive multiple documents, up to 1GB per individual attachment.

The bid must be gathered per section and separated as follows:

If the Bidder chooses to submit its bid in hard copies, Canada requests that the Bidder submits its bid in separately bound sections as follows:

If the Bidder is simultaneously providing copies of its bid using multiple acceptable delivery methods, and if there is a discrepancy between the wording of any of these copies and the electronic copy provided through epost Connect service, the wording of the electronic copy provided through epost Connect service will have priority over the wording of the other copies.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of hard copy of their bid:

- (a) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper;
- (b) use a numbering system that corresponds to the bid solicitation.

In April 2006, Canada issued a policy directing federal departments and agencies to take the necessary steps to incorporate environmental considerations into the procurement process [Policy on Green Procurement](https://www.tbs-sct.gc.ca/pol/doc-eng.aspx?id=32573) (<https://www.tbs-sct.gc.ca/pol/doc-eng.aspx?id=32573>). To assist Canada in reaching its objectives, bidders should:

- 1) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper containing fibre certified as originating from a sustainably-managed forest and containing minimum 30% recycled content; and
- 2) use an environmentally-preferable format including black and white printing instead of colour printing, printing double sided/duplex, using staples or clips instead of cerlox, duotangs or binders.

Section I: Technical Bid

In their technical bid, Bidders should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

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Section II: Financial Bid

Bidders must submit their financial bid in accordance with the Basis of Payment.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

The Bidder must provide written documentation that the proposed UPLC system is compatible with Sciex 65000 Q trap MS system.

Evidence must be from a third party source, such as a list of compatible equipment published by Sciex.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

The price of the bid will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes excluded, FOB destination, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included.

The Evaluated Price will be the Total Firm Extended Price.

The Total Firm Extended Price is the sum of the Firm Extended Prices of all the line items.

4.2 Basis of Selection – Mandatory Technical Criteria

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

ANNEX A

REQUIREMENT

1.0 SCOPE

1.1. Objective:

Health Canada requires an Ultra High Pressure Liquid Chromatograph (UPLC) system for its Regulatory Operations and Regions Branch (RORB) Food Laboratory in Ontario.

1.2. Background:

The RORB Food Laboratory seeks to enhance its existing capabilities for the analysis of various food commodities. Currently, the existing UPLC is over 10 years old, and is attached to a Sciex 6500 QTRAP. Incompatible software and communication issues between the current UPLC system and the Sciex 6500Q Trap mass spectrometer has led to data acquisition and processing delays. This requirement is for the purchase of an UPLC system that is compatible in hardware and software to the Sciex 6500 Q trap.

1.3. Terminology:

UPLC: Ultra High Pressure Liquid Chromatograph
RORB: Regulatory Operations and Regions Branch

2.0 REQUIREMENTS

The UPLC system must:

- 2.1 Be compatible with the existing Sciex 65000 QTRAP MS system.
- 2.2 Have an autosampler that:
 - 2.2.1 Has an injection volume range from 0.1 to 20 uL in 0.1 uL increments;
 - 2.2.2 Has a precision of <0.15% RSD;
 - 2.2.3 Has a sample capacity of 400 vials (2mL);
 - 2.2.4 Has a sample temperature range between 4 to 40 degree Celsius or better.
- 2.3 Have a column compartment that:
 - 2.3.1 Has a Peltier cooling and heating with two independent temperature zones from 20°C below ambient up to 100°C or better;
 - 2.3.2 Has a temperature stability of +/-0.03°C;
 - 2.3.3 Has a temperature accuracy of +/- 0.05°C;
 - 2.3.4 Has a temperature precision of 0.05°C;
 - 2.3.5 Can heat up or cool down at the following rates: 5 min from ambient to 40°C, 10 min from 40°C to 20°C and <30 min from 25°C to 100 °C.
- 2.4 LC System
 - 2.4.1 Operation pressure range: System must have an operating range up to 1300 bar or more up to 2 ml/min, 800 bar at 5 ml/min to ensure compatibility with HPLC and UHPLC methods and optimally support all column dimension (2.1 – 4.6mm ID; STM particles);

- 2.4.2 Must have a settable flow range from 0.001 to 5ml/min in 0.001 ml/min increment;
- 2.4.3 Must be compatible with a pH range of 1.0-12.5;
- 2.4.4 Must have Flow precision: $\leq 0.07\%$ RSD or ≤ 0.005 min SD;
- 2.4.5. Must have composition precision of $\leq 0.15\%$ RSD or better;
- 2.4.6 Must have an integrated degassing unit for purging and priming the pump;
- 2.4.7 Must have a safety and maintenance feature for extensive diagnostic, error detection, leak detection, safe leak handling and low voltage;
- 2.4.8 Must have a hydraulic system: dual pistons in series;
- 2.4.9 Must have a binary pump.

2.5 Data System & Software

- 2.5.1 Software must work with Analyst software version 1.6.2.

3.0 DELIVERABLES AND ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

- 3.1 The Contractor must provide an installation report identifying details of the instrument's parameters upon setup.
- 3.2 System must be installed and configured on site.
- 3.3 A representative of the manufacturer must demonstrate that all specifications have been met.
- 3.4 The Contractor must provide a familiarization training on a mutually agreeable date between the Contractor and the Project Authority.
