#### Question 9

#### 2.7 Basis for Canada's Ownership of Intellectual Property

a. This section states that "...any intellectual property rights arising from the performance of the Work under the resulting contract will belong to Canada". Does this mean that there is no possibility of publishing any of the resultant in a peer review journal for example? Can this be negotiated after the contract is awarded?

#### Answer 9

No, the section does not preclude the possibility of publishing a paper based on the work in a peerreviewed journal. This can be negotiated after the contract is awarded and a license to publish can be granted.

#### Question 10

#### **3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions**

- a. Can the Bid be single-spaced?
- b. There is no maximum page length, correct? Is there a suggested approximate length?

#### **Question 11**

**Section 7.4.1/7.4.2 and Section 6.4-p.31 of Annex A(Statement of Work).** The contract ends August 31, 2019 as specified in Section 7.4.1 and 7.4.2. In Annex A (p.31, section 6.4) however, it is stated that the final report is to be submitted by May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Which is the correct date?

#### **Question 12**

Annex A: Statement of Work (p.29). It is not clear if the solicitation is asking for merely a comprehensive literature review or if a primary research study involving the collection of new data is also required. Given this ambiguity, can the bidder propose original data collection as part of the proposed methodology to answer the objectives as outlined in the statement of work knowing that there are no funds available for travel? Or could the financial bid include funds associated with the operating costs of collecting raw data for the proposed study?





### Answer 12

The solicitation / scope of work is a comprehensive literature review with no collection of new data.

### Question 13

Annex A: Statement of Work (p.29). Can the parameters of 'publically-funded social programming' be defined further? For example, does it include government as well non-governmental organizations, assumedly yes? Would school-based primary programs be included for example? Most likely yes I would suspect.

#### Answer 13

Yes, it includes both government and non-governmental organizations, so school-based primary programs would be eligible for inclusion.

#### Question 14

Annex A: Statement of Work (p.29). The manner in which the Statement of Work is written implies that the scope of work is to focus exclusively on children and adolescents. Is this correct?

#### Answer 14

The scope of work is not limited to children and adolescents. For instance, tertiary crime prevention, which is mentioned multiple times in the Statement of Work, involves programming for preventing recidivism among adult offenders.

#### Question 15

Annex A, section 7.2 (p. 32) specifies that the final report should be no longer than 50 pages. Is this single or double-spaced?

The final report should be no longer than 50 pages, single-spaced.
