2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Annex A – Statement of Requirement

CFS Leitrim Supply and CFIOG LCMMs require new warehouse racking including installation and removal services to perform the warehouse modification project in compliance with safety standards.

Need:

The shelving are required to store Clothing Store and other crown asset equipment. The shelving must be able to support a minimum of 1500 pounds per level. The shelving need to be spaced enough to have clearance for machinery to circulate between the two shelving with secured clearance. The machinery is a not-rotating rectangle vehicle measuring 4ft wide x9ft long. It is design to go up and down like an elevator.

The A shelving must have a total length of 64 feet. The A shelving must be at least 4 feet wide and subdivided by sections of 8 feet long. The A shelving must have at least 6 levels high per 8 feet long section.

The B shelving must have a total length of 28 feet. The B shelving must be at least 4 feet wide and subdivided by section of 7 feet long. The B shelving must have at least 6 levels high per 7 feet long section.

The C shelving must have a total length of 32 feet. The C shelving must be at least 42 inches wide and subdivided by section of 8 feet long. The C shelving must have at least 3 levels high per 8 feet long section.

The D shelving must have a total length of 11 feet. The D shelving must be at least 4 feet wide and subdivided by section of 11 feet long. The D shelving must have at least 3 levels high per 11 feet long section.


The shelving A, B, C and D cannot be higher than 12 feet.

The shelving must be bolted on the ground and a secure clearance of 3 feet must be respected between roof piping and the top row of the shelving. The old yellow paint line on the concrete will have to be erased and a new one will have to be redrawn. The used paint must last for at least 20 years on the concrete floor. The Floor is made of poured concrete, there is no constraint for maximum total weight known.

Constraint:

The shelving will have to be built IAW **A-LM-186-001/JS-001** safety rule and regulation. The shelving will have to be built in metal and will have to be clear from any emergency exits or other escape route. A corridor of at least 5 feet must be respected between each shelving.

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

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
