

The following Questions and Answers are regarding RFP 01R11-19-C034 – Asbestos Surveys and Asbestos Management Plans

QUESTION 1:

In regard to Rated Requirement R2.2: will ongoing or substantially completed projects be accepted here or must the project be officially completed?

ANSWER 1:

Yes, ongoing and substantially completed projects will be accepted. Ongoing and substantially completed projects should indicate their percent (%) completion and this will form the maximum amount of possible marks to be allotted. For example, a project that is 50% complete will be worth a maximum of 5 points.

QUESTION 2:

In regards to both Rated Requirement R2.1 and R2.2: "Project timeframes must not be overlapping, and if so will be counted only once". As this requirement is addressed to the Bidding Firm's experience (which was not given a numeric value to meet), does this mean projects completed simultaneously over the same time period will not be counted?

ANSWER 2:

Projects must be distinct and conducted under separate contracts/scope of work. Multiple projects can be completed simultaneously but under separate contracts. For example, one contract requesting a hazardous material assessment, asbestos management plan and asbestos abatement would count as one project. If there was a distinct scope of work and resulting contract for each of those items, it would be considered 3 contracts and 3 projects. If projects were conducted simultaneously for separate clients, each project would be considered as one project.

QUESTION 3:

Must all 4 representative projects in R2.1 be non-overlapping?

ANSWER 3:

See answer 2.

QUESTION 4:

Rated criteria R2.2 on page 40 of the RFP states "Using project descriptions, the Bidder demonstrates that they have completed at least 1 project in the last 8 years for a federal government client. Additional marks will be assigned for each additional project up to a maximum of 3. Up to 10 points will be given for each project that demonstrates experience for a federal government client."

Do the projects used to demonstrate experience with federal government projects need to be specifically about Asbestos Surveys and Asbestos Management Plans or can other federal environmental and/or health and safety projects be used to demonstrate this experience and still obtain maximum points?

ANSWER 4:

The projects used to demonstrate experience with a federal government client do not need to be specifically about Asbestos Surveys and Asbestos Management Plans. Other federal environmental and/or health and safety projects can be used to demonstrate this experience and obtain maximum points.
