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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

Note: Bids will not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. This email is only to initiate an ePost Connect conversation, as detailed in the Standard Instructions.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Quebec.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

ANNEX "A" REQUIREMENT

SINGLE FREQUENCY FIBRE LASER

1. CONTEXT

Defence Research and Development Canada Valcartier (DRDC) is developing a coherent lidar for atmospheric sensing. DRDC requires, for the coherent source, a 1550 nm fibre laser with a very narrow linewidth, an integrated frequency modulation module and high output power. A rack mount system is also required as it needs to be integrated in the portable system.

2. TECHNICAL CRITERIA

The single frequency fibre laser must consist of the following, but not limited to, complete hardware and all the necessary hardware and software to make it a laser system.

The Contractor must demonstrate that the proposed laser system meets the requirements with the following technical criteria:

No.	Technical Criteria
1	Weight: Less or equal to 30kg
2	Center wavelength: Between 1540nm and 1560nm
3	Emission spectral linewidth: Less or equal to 10kHz
4	Beam quality (M^2): Less or equal to 1.1
5	Output power: Greater or equal to 1W
6	Fast wavelength modulation: Integrated module for fast wavelength modulation
7	Fast wavelength modulation range: Greater or equal to 5GHz
8	Fast wavelength modulation rate: Greater or equal to 5kHz
9	Access to seed laser before amplifier: Required for synchronisation

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10	Computer control: Via USB or Ethernet
11	Required power supply: Between 100-120V, 60Hz

- French and/or English User Manual and performance report (paper or electronic form).
- Performance report given at the delivery: A characterization of the laser parameters. At the minimum, the report should include the measurement results of the laser wavelength, the linewidth and the output power. It should also include how the measurement was performed. This report is the results of the factory test.
