C) QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q31 Indigenous Partners represent many languages. Is there a process for working with these multiple languages?

A31 Communities contributing to the panel have the ability to contribute in the language of their choice. There is possibility to include a shared common panel that addresses languages, but that is the decision of our indigenous partners.

Q32 How do you envision the relationship between the Indigenous Partners and the consultant group? **A32** The consultant group will be able to attend meetings and develop personal relationship with the partner communities through these meetings. Communication between the indigenous partners and the consultant should use the PCA project team as an intermediary.

Q33 Are the contracts with indigenous partners to submit panel content on a schedule?

A33 Yes, the schedule has been set such that most communities have already met their deliverables and are ready to work with the consultants on editing and graphic design.

Q34 Have communities been given guidelines about size and content?

A34 Communities have been given general guidelines about panel content (preferably 200 words or less) and size (about 6-8 feet x 3 feet). Communities are choosing their own narrative to include.

Q35 Is there any thematic structure for content?

A35 The communities are contributing their own stories without an overall theme. Some general themes will likely emerge from the stories communities choose to share.

Q36 The schedule is quite aggressive; there may not be enough room for review times.

A36 We will work with the successful consultant to create a revised schedule that makes review times as efficient and effective as possible.

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Q37 There is some possibly conflicting information in the project brief section 3.1.1. about what skills the prime contractor is required to have-in house can you clarify?

A37 The prime contractor should be able to provide one or more of the skills in section 3.1.1. in-house, but does not necessarily need to provide them all in-house.

Q39 Is there a firm finish date?

A39 Timelines within the schedule may be flexible regarding the primary construction window in Fall 2019 but a firm finish time of the end of May 2020.

Q40 List of communities- are the communities currently contracted to complete panels identified on a separate list?

A40 No, the exhibit is for the benefit all forum members regardless if they have already engaged on panel creation.

Q41 Is Parks Canada Interested in involving partner communities in construction?

A41 Yes, as much as possible.

Q42 Has PCA thought about expected life span?

A42 Exhibit is intended to be permanent. Panels should be designed to be updatable/replaceable in the future in case of changes required or damage to panels.

Q43 Wildlife- How will vegetation be protected from wildlife?

A43 We want to incorporate good practices with regards to animal attractants as well as feedback from our indigenous partners regarding what landscaping species are appropriate/preferred.

Q44 Will environmental assessment be updated?

A44 Preliminary assessment has been done and we have the go ahead to proceed following general best practices.

Q45 What is the historic/cultural assessment of the site?

A45 Accidental finds protocol is to be followed. Site has been subject to significant disturbance over last 50 years.
