A. Questions and Answers

Q1 Summary of Work (1.4) The contract suggests that the owner is supplying aggregates to the contractor for use on this project.

A1 Yes

Q2 Summary of Work (1.4) Are the materials available? If not, when will the materials be available? **A2** Yes, refer to Section 32 01 13.01 Section 2.2.4

Q3 Summary of Work (1.4) Are there any QC results on the materials to show that it meets the specified requirements?

A3 Yes

Q4 Summary of Work (1.4) Who is responsible for line painting? If the owner is supplying line painting, what is the general contractors signing responsibility between time of construction and paint application? **A4** The owner is responsible for line painting. Refer to Section 01 55 26 Part 1.6.9 and Part 3

Q5 Indigenous Benefits: 20/24 (2.) Please clarify if a contractor does not fulfil their guarantee on Indigenous employment how the Government or owner will withhold funds on the contractor. How will compliance specifically be measured?

A5 With failure to fulfil a guarantee of the Indigenous Business Plan the gross payable amount will be reduced by the assessment value to come to a new contract payable amount. Compliance is specifically measured by APPENDIX 3 – REQUIREMENT FOR INDIGENOUS BENEFITS Part C which is a comparison of Contractor Achievement against Bidder Guarantee & Certification at time of bid submission for the 1) human resources plan, 2) Indigenous benefits plan, 3) Skills development plan and 4) other measures guaranteed.

Q6 Indigenous Benefits: 20/24 (3) who will determine the penalty to be applied to the contractor? **A6** Parks Canada Agency

Q7 Indigenous Benefits: Is there a specific individual or native band employment office to call to efficiently seek those actually looking for employment?

A7 Please connect with each of the 7 bands listed under First Nations from local area of Contract.

Q8 Indigenous Benefits: Does the federal government have an approved vendors list of locally owned Native owned companies that would qualify for the incentives that this contract is trying to impose?

A11 Owner preference coordinated with other work.

Q12 What sort of seal mix design does the owner require?

A12 Refer to Section 01 45 00 Clause 1.2.2.1; Section 32 01 13.01 Clauses 1.2.4.5, 1.6.2 and 3.3.2.10. The mix design shall specify target application rates for both the aggregate and binder as well as permissible operating tolerances so that adjustments may be made due to carrying field conditions.
