Amendment 003

This amendment is being raised to extend the solicitation closing date, revise the tender package, answer questions from the optional site visit and replace Appendix 1 – Combined Price Form.

A. Bid Closing Date

The closing date for tender 5P420-19-0059/A is extended from June 18, 2019 to June 20, 2019 at 2:00PM Mountain Daylight Time (MDT).

C. Questions

Q10: Can the decking planks at the arbor platform be reused?

A10: Yes, decking planks are to be salvaged and reused.

Q11: Can the bill of material for the lumber on site be provided?

A11: Yes, bill of material is provided in the attached folder: *DSP2.zip*

Q12: Will yellow paint on the edges of the boardwalk and arbor platform be required.

A12: No, this is not within the scope of the project.

Q13: How level will the boardwalk need to be?

A13: The boardwalk will need to be as level as possible from side to side. This will require field fitting and approval from the Parks Canada on site representative.

Q14: Can the canoe rack that is being disassembled be used for temporary bracing.

A14: Yes, the canoe rack can be used for temporary bracing.

Q15: What type of survey is required?

A15: We will require elevation and contours. A map of the area to be surveyed has been provided.

Q16: Are any permits required?

A16: A restricted activity permit will be required along with a Parks Canada Business permit.

Q17: Is there a quad on site for the winning contractor to use.

A17: No, there is no machinery available on site. Bringing in a machine capable of lifting and moving heavier sections of boardwalk may increase project efficiency.

Q18: What is the warranty period?

A18: As per GC3.13 Warranty and rectification of defects in work, the warranty period will be in effect for 12 months from the date of Substantial Performance. As per Section 01 78 00 of the revised specifications, the contractor will conduct a 9-month warranty inspection, measured from time of acceptance, by PC Representative.

Q19: Are the working hours 8:30 to 5:00?

A19: Working hours will be unrestricted. Labour code laws must be followed.

Q20: How often will Parks Canada representative flights be required?

A20: Parks Canada Representative flights will be required at least every 2 weeks. Representative flown on food and garbage flights.

Q21: What are the dimensions of the tent pads?

A21: Tent pads are 13' by 14'.

Q22: Will training videos be required?

A22: No

Q23: Does the new boardwalk need to be complete prior to the removal of the old one.

A23: Yes. If during construction it becomes clear that the new boardwalk will be done with time to spare, the possibility of doing both the removal and construction at the same time will be considered.

Q24: Do helical piles need to be stored at maintenance yard.

A24: Helical piles do not need to be stored at the maintenance yard but must be kept in an organised and neat fashion, then flown off of site.

Q25: Does Gravel need to be imported?

A25: There is no requirement for gravel on this project. Materials within the boardwalk and arbor footprint are to be used.

Q26: Do nails need to be used to fasten the cribs?

A26: 10 inch lag bolts are to be used for fastening the cribs.

Q27: How much material is to be removed from each helical pile? How should this be priced?

A27: Assume an average of 3ft from each helical pile needs to be removed. Provide a unit price for removing the helical piles of \$/kg. 3ft per pile= 3611kg. Piles to be removed from site and disposed of properly. See Item #7 in revised Unit Price Table below.

Q28: Can the 3.5" decking screw be increased to 4"?

A28: Due to maintenance constraints the 3.5" decking screw cannot change size. Must be gold coloured screws.

Q29: Can the contractor start before September 3rd?

A29: The contractor will be allowed to start on August 12th. They will only have access to 2 tent pads and will not be permitted use of the care takers cabin before September 3rd. Workers will need to be mindful that there will be visitors staying on site at this time and that they must be respectful of noise and disruptions.
