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### **Solicitation Amendment No. 003**

This solicitation is hereby amended to provide the following questions and answers:

#### **Question 5:**

Comment:

The mandatory requirements represented by M2 indicate that the Proposed Project Management Resource have over five years' experience over the past ten years in similar projects. This is a reasonable expectation of an advanced Project Manager (PM) as required by this Program. In the associated definition of "similar projects" in Annex F, para a, there are five elements for consideration. This discussion will focus on sub-paragraph (i).

Sub-para (i) stipulates that "a project must have been completed by the Bidder itself (and cannot include the experience of any proposed subcontractor or any affiliate of the Bidder)".

It is our understanding that the Crown is stipulating that all projects to be considered as evidence as to the capability of the Project Manager must have been conducted while the candidate was an employee of the Bidder. Please confirm.

Question:

Referring to ANNEX F Evaluation Criteria and Selection Method, para a) For Previous Similar Projects, sub-para (i): would the Crown modify the text from "a project must have been completed by the Bidder itself (and cannot include the experience of any proposed subcontractor or any affiliate of the Bidder)" and replace it with "must be a full-time employee of the Bidder as of the date of the release of this RFP"? This will facilitate the assignment of the most appropriate resource to this category while maintaining the intent of the requirement. It will remain the responsibility of the Bidder to demonstrate that the experience of the PM will address the remaining requirements of the Program.

#### **Answer 5:**

The Crown is willing to change the wording in Annex F Evaluation Criteria and Selection Method, para a) For Previous Similar Projects, sub-para (i): to must be a full-time employee of the Bidder as of the date of the release of this RFP.

#### **Question 6:**

What is / is there a difference between "the resource has experience leading a minimum of ... projects" in criteria M7, M18 and "proposed resource has experience as a Contract Technical Lead on .... Projects" in criteria M27?

#### **Answer 6:**

They are the same. Evaluation criteria has been updated, and now reads "proposed resource has experience leading five Royal Canadian Navy Human Factors (Cognitive) or Royal Canadian Navy Human Factors Engineering contracted projects."

#### **Question 7:**

Regarding criteria **M7**, **M18** and **M27** would experience on project that are applicable or of value for Royal Canadian Navy would be considered as valid (Not RCN as direct client but work / project that could lead or be used by RCN as the end user), to be more precise experience on DnD projects, DnD IDEaS, DRDC Atlantics or Valcartier ?

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**Answer 7:**

Experience on projects completed for DRDC or DND, where the application of the work was specifically focused on the RCN, are valid.

Experience on DND IDEaS projects are not valid.

**Question 8:**

Regarding criteria **M7**, **M18** and **M27** would Human Factors experience on project that cover subjects related to “Military scenario Narrative Development, Military measures of performance / of effectiveness (MOP / MOE), Statistical Analysis” in other service branches such as Army and Air Force would be considered valid ?

**Answer 8:**

No. Due to the unique nature of the RCN domain we require the Human Factors experience on projects to be directly linked to the RCN.

**Question 9:**

Regarding criteria **M7**, **M18** and **M27** would experience with other Armed Forces than Canadian Armed Force would be considered valid?

**Answer 9:**

No. Due to the unique nature of the RCN domain we require the Human Factors experience on projects to be directly linked to the RCN.

**Question 10:**

In Annex B Basis of Payment, the first two paragraphs are contradictory. Paragraph one states that estimated hours per year are NOT intended to estimate actual utilization. Paragraph 2 seems to state that the estimated hours DO represent estimated utilization but may be performed by numerous resources. Please clarify the intended meaning and whether “numerous resources” is within one category, or across several.

**Answer 10:**

Annex B Basis of Payment has been revised to remove the second sentence.

**Question 11:**

Please confirm that interpretation of Annex B Basis of Payment paragraph 3 that in the event that less than \$50k of labour (excluding expenses) is assigned and conducted then at year end, the Crown will pay the holder of the TAC the difference.

**Answer 11:**

Yes, DRDC confirms that your interpretation is correct.

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**Question 12:**

The relevant degrees listed are limited. Other proposals for the Crown list more extensive examples of relevant degrees. There are other degrees which have similar workloads and educational requirements but are given different names by different institutions, for example cognitive neuroscience is now used equivalently for cognitive psychology. For evaluation criteria of resource categories A3, A4, A5 and A6, would the Crown consider re-wording the "Relevant Degrees" to "Examples of Relevant Degrees" or add the wording "other similar degrees" to the list?

**Answer 12:**

Relevant degrees in the specific resource category will be evaluated

**Question 13:**

The SOW suggests that work under this contract could entail evaluations and research pertaining to Navy procurements. For example, several companies are currently under contract to perform human factors work on the Canadian Surface Combatant (CSC) ship programme, thereby creating conditions for a conflict of interest with this TAC. Clearly, any conflict of interest would be counter to the best interests of Canada. Will persons engaged in human factors work for the CSC ship programme or other government maritime procurement programs be barred from bidding on this TAC?

**Answer 13:**

This statement "The Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) is undergoing platform refits, upgrades, and new procurements in order to meet the needs of today's defence and security operations. The work engages human factors, in the form of guidelines and research, to ensure that physical environments, platforms, and technology are designed and procured to meet the needs and capabilities of operational personnel." frames current work being completed by the RCN, and indicates how high-level research and development requirements from this TAC could be used to inform future procurements beyond the anticipated timeframe of the current CSC procurement timelines. Work in the current TAC is not linked to, and will not be used in, any current CSC ship programme procurements or evaluations.

The task categories in the SOW are reflective of the type of work expected in this TAC. All of those task categories are related to research and development, not to the evaluation and procurement of goods for any existing DND contracts.

No exclusions are required.

**Question 14:**

Some team members hold a degree from Universities outside of Canada, are Canadian citizens and have over 15 years of experience working for DND/DRDC. Their degrees have been provided and accepted by the Crown on numerous successfully competed solicitations. The requirement to have these academic credentials assessed by the Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC) is new. Some degrees were earned before the CICIC started in 1990. We have been advised by CICIC it will take at least 8 weeks to have the credentials assessed.

**Answer 14:**

Answer in question 15 below.

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**Question 15:**

Would the Crown accept degrees from Universities outside of Canada if they have previously been accepted by the Crown (demonstrated by Contracts awarded with named resources)?

**Answer 15:**

Yes. This would eliminate the need for CICICI confirmation.

**Question 16:**

Would the Crown accept the relevant pages from a Canadian University Official calendar listing the individual concerned and their degrees earned?

**Answer 16:**

Yes, but this is only necessary if there are individuals that do not satisfy the solution proposed in answer 15.

**Question 17:**

Would the Crown accept a letter from the CICIC indicating that the team member has applied to the CICIC for an assessment with information about the processing time?

**Answer 17:**

Yes, but this is only necessary if there are individuals that do not satisfy the solution proposed in answer 15.

**Question 18:**

Would the Crown grant a 4-week extension to 7 August to allow the recommended processing time for these assessments and ensure there is no competitive disadvantage?

**Answer 18:**

Yes, but this is only necessary if there are individuals that do not satisfy the solution proposed in answer 15.

**Question 19:**

- A) The instructions are to use the Project Description Template provided for the point-rated criteria projects. Is this template also to be used for the proposed resources projects or are the projects simply to be clearly described in the resumes?
- B) Can a project be used for more than one point-rated criteria if it satisfies multiple criterion?

**Answer 19:**

- A.) Yes, please use the template for both the point-rated criteria and to describe the proposed resources projects.
- B.) Yes.

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**Question 20:**

We respectfully request an extension of the solicitation closing date of three weeks. The complexity and number of resources specified by the RFP has meant that we require some extra time to field the strongest possible team.

**Answer 20:**

The solicitation closing date will be changed to July 31, 2019.

# EVALUATION CRITERIA AND SELECTION METHOD (revised July 9, 2019)

## PURCHASE REQUEST TOOL TRACKING NUMBER: 2017-17898

The Bidder must provide the necessary documentation to support compliance with this requirement.

a) **For Previous Similar Projects:** Where the bid must include a description of previous similar projects:

- (i) must be a full-time employee of the Bidder as of the date of the release of this RFP;
- (ii) a project must have been completed by the bid closing date;
- (iii) a project is considered to be a minimum of 3 months of full time effort
- (iv) if more similar projects are provided than requested, Canada will decide in its discretion which projects will be evaluated. A project will be considered "similar" to the Work to be performed under any resulting contract if the project was for the performance of work that closely matches the *descriptions* of the Resource Categories identified in Annex "A" – Statement of Work. Work will be considered to "closely match" if the work in the provided project is described in at least 50% of the points of responsibility listed in the description of the given Resource Category.
- (v) Project Descriptions are requested to be limited to 1 page in length each and to use the provided template at Attachment A – Project Description Template

- b) **For Proposed Resources:** The technical bid must include the number of résumés, per Resource Category, as identified in Annex "A" – Statement of Work. The same individual must not be proposed for more than one Resource Category at the Senior Level. The Technical bid must demonstrate that each proposed individual meets the qualification requirements described (including any educational requirements, and work experience requirement). With respect to the proposed resources:

- (i) Proposed resources may be employees of the Bidder or employees of a subcontractor, or these individuals may be independent contractors to whom the Bidder would subcontract a portion of the Work
- (ii) For educational requirements for a particular degree, designation or certificate, Canada will only consider educational programmes that were successfully completed by the resource by the time of bid closing. If the degree, designation or certification was issued by an educational institution outside of Canada, the Bidder must provide a copy of the results of the academic credential assessment and qualification recognition service issued by an agency or organization recognized by the Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC). Degrees from outside of Canada that have been previously accepted by the Crown will be accepted in absence of CICIC assessments. Proof of previous acceptance required
- (iii) For work experience, Canada will not consider experience gained as part of an educational programme, except for experience gained through a formal cooperative programme at a post-secondary institution.
- (iv) For any requirements that specify a particular time period (e.g., 2 years) of work experience, Canada will disregard any information about experience if the technical bid does not include the relevant dates (month and year) for the experience claimed (i.e., the start date and end date). Canada will evaluate only the duration that the resource actually worked on a project or projects (from his or her start date to end date), instead of the overall start and end date of a project or a combination of projects in which a resource has participated.

- (v) For work experience to be considered by Canada, the technical bid must not simply indicate the title of the individual's position, but must demonstrate that the resource has the required work experience by explaining the responsibilities and work performed by the individual while in that position. In situations in which a proposed resource worked at the same time on more than one project, the duration of any overlapping time period will be counted only once toward any requirements that relate to the individual's length of experience
