**THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENT TO THE BID DOCUMENTS IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY. THE ADDENDUM SHALL FORM A PART OF THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.**

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**Question #1**

Will just the creosote timbers, if any encountered, need to go to Norris arm or will all wood products from old wharf whether creosote or not need to be disposed of at North Arm?

**Question #2**

Will any rock ballast taken from the wharf that's not suitable for Shoreline armament be required to go to a certified landfill such as Norris arm also or can the old ballast be donated to a local gravel pit?

**Response #1 & 2**

This is outlined in the project specifications, sections 01 35 43, 01 74 21 & 02 41 16.

**Follow up Question on #2**

OK fair enough on my question number 1. I see now that the Creosote if any goes to Norris Arm and the rest of the natural wood will go to Indian Bay \$136ton- perfect.

BUT on question number 2 given the huge amount of money at stake your answer seems unfair. I cannot find any mention about ROCK BALLAST in the NL provincial disposal regulations. In 01 74 21 - 1.8 "Disposal Requirements" #10 states the contractor cannot sell salvaged items on site. So we are then to assume if the contractor sells the ballast rock that is allowed it just cannot take place on site and has to go to an approved gravel pit?

**Response #2**

Rock Ballast is not contaminated, and can therefore go to any approved waste disposal facility, as indicated in the spec. We do not provide tipping/ disposal costs as the contractors are free to shop around for the best price, provided they follow the other requirements.

As long as the contractor can get written permission from a waste disposal facility, to accept the type of waste being proposed for disposal, (this could be their own pit), then DFO-SCH is fine with that.
