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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

There is no security requirement associated with this solicitation.

1.2 Statement of Requirement

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than ten (10) calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in British Columbia.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. ANNEX "A"

STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT

The National Research Council's (NRC) Design and Fabrication Service (DFS) has a requirement for one (1) Vertical Computerized Numerical Controlled (CNC) Machining Centre.

NRC/DFS provides manufacturing service capabilities in support of the Herzberg Astronomy and Astrophysics Research Centre. In collaboration with HAA, DFS fabricates high precision prototype and production assemblies to meet high tolerance requirements found in Radio Wave and Optical instrumentation bought by international groups for use in large telescope found around the world. In the case of Radio Astronomy, arrays of telescopes are used to gather radio waves for processing. These arrays require matching instruments and machined parts that must be extremely precise and repeatable in their tolerance. For Optical astronomy precision alignment of optical components is vital to the success of the instrument thus requiring high accuracy in achieving tight tolerance and high positional accuracy.

This unit will add to or replace NRC's aging machinery, capacity and new technologies that will allow DFS to meet the growing needs of HAA as it looks forward to future astronomical instruments. The newer Vertical CNC Machining Centre will contribute, for many years, to the production of high accuracy components and assemblies for NRC Herzberg Astronomy and Astrophysics Research Centre.

For each mandatory technical criterion, the Bidder must indicate whether the products proposed are compliant or not compliant by checking the appropriate box. Bidders MUST PROVIDE documentation to demonstrate compliance with the specifications and cross-reference with the page number of their supplied documentation. Simply stating that they meet the criterion is not sufficient. When referencing other documents submitted with the bid, the bidder should indicate the exact location of the referenced documents, including the document title, page number and paragraph/subparagraph number.

The Bidder must provide a response for each criterion. The Bidder must provide sufficient detail to permit a complete evaluation.
