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## **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **1.1 Statement of Requirement**

The requirement is detailed under Annex A – Statement of Requirement.

### **1.2 Debriefings**

### **2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation**

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than **FIVE (5)** calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

### **2.4 Applicable Laws**

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Nova Scotia.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. ## **ANNEX "A" - STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT**

### **1. Object**

The National Research Council of Canada (NRC) wants to expand their high-throughput cell analysis research capacity in the Molecular Biology Facility, Halifax. The addition of this capability will strengthen and directly support R&D capabilities in areas of strategic importance to ACRD Research Center including microalgal cell factories, bio-sensing of marine microorganisms, and further development and exploitation of ACRD's microalgae library for high value products including nutraceuticals and feed ingredients. Within this mandate, the NRC wishes to purchase a portable flow cytometer.

The work consists of supply, delivery, installation of the system at the NRC address and training on equipment use.

### **2. Constraints**

1. Flow cytometer, not including computer workstation, must have a total footprint not exceeding 20" H x 24" W x 16.5" D, and be able to be placed inside a biosafety cabinet.
2. Flow cytometer, not including computer workstation, must not exceed 30 pounds due to need to relocate, decontaminate and servicing considerations.

### **1. Mandatory Technical Specifications**

1. The Flow cytometer must have the capability for manual tub loading and/or high throughput auto-sampling option.
2. The Flow cytometer must support future upgradeability and evolution of assay design for manual tube loading and/or a high throughput auto-sampling option.
3. The auto-sampler must be a single option that can analyze standard 96-well plates (flat, round and v-bottom), deep well 96-well plates, 48-well plates as well as 12x75mm tubes via a 24-tube rack.
4. Must use 0.2um filtered DI water to minimize total cost of operation.
5. The proposed system must have a rapid, automated and simple quality control (QC) program to support ease of use by non-experience flow cytometry users.
6. Must be a plug and play system that requires no specialized installer/installation. Quoted package must include control systems or computer required for operation and analysis of data as well as software for such systems.
7. Must be CSA approved.
8. Must have free downloadable software templates including premade flow cytometry plots, population gates and statistic tables for analysis of a variety of life sciences assays to support ease of use by non-experienced flow cytometry users.
9. The proposed system must use software that does not require any specialized onsite training to support ease by non-experienced flow cytometry users.
10. The instrument must include option to modify configuration to fit researcher assay requirements.
11. Must demonstrate past success of its application in a large number of high impact scientific publications.
12. Must have a Module for Selectable Lasers: Facilitates standard three detectors off of blue laser and one off of red laser. Allows for four blue detectors or two blue and two red detectors. Must include optical filters: 510/15 nm, 540/20 nm, 780/60 nm, 610/20 nm, and 630/30 nm.

### **4. Technical**

Technical documentation: The system must include at least one operating manual in English and one in French upon delivery.
