

#### **PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### 1.1 Introduction

The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is divided into six parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

- Part 1 General Information: provides a general description of the requirement;
- Part 2 Offeror Instructions: provides the instructions applicable to the clauses and conditions of the RFSO:
- Part 3 Offer Preparation Instructions: provides offerors with instructions on how to prepare their offer to address the evaluation criteria specified;
- Part 4 Evaluation Procedures and Basis of Selection: indicates how the evaluation will be conducted, the evaluation criteria which must be addressed in the offer, and the basis of selection:
- Part 5 Certifications and Additional Information: includes the certifications and additional information to be provided;
- Part 6 6A, Standing Offer, and 6B, Resulting Contract Clauses:

6A, includes the Standing Offer containing the offer from the Offeror and the applicable clauses and conditions;

6B, includes the clauses and conditions which will apply to any contract resulting from a callup made pursuant to the Standing Offer.

The Annexes include the Statement of Requirement, the Basis of Payment, the Standing Offer reporting and any other annexes.

## 1.2 Summary

- A. Department of National Defence (DND) Canadian Forces Health Services (CFHS) has a requirement to acquire Laboratory Blind Testing Material to test laboratory equipment of 14 CAF laboratories across Canada which are located at Halifax, Greenwood, Gagetown, Borden, Valcartier, St-Jean, Petawawa, Trenton, Kingston, Edmonton, Cold Lake, Esquimalt, Comox and Winnipeg. The implementation of the proficiency testing at all CAF laboratories must ensure compliance with the accreditation Canada standards. Upon receipt of the tests conducted by the various DND laboratories, the Contractor must create statistical reports.
- B. The period of the Standing Offer is for two (2) years with two (2) additional one (1) year optional periods.
- C. The requirement is subject to the provisions of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA), Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement, Canada-Honduras Free Trade Agreement, Canada-Panama Free Trade Agreement, Canada-Korea Free Trade Agreement (CKFTA) and Canada-Chile Free Trade Agreement (CCFTA).
- D. The Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) is to establish National Individual Standing Offer (NISO) for the requirement detailed in the RFSO, to the Identified Users across Canada, excluding locations within Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Quebec, and Labrador that are subject to Comprehensive Land Claims Agreements (CLCAs). Any requirement for deliveries to locations within CLCAs areas within Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, Quebec, or Labrador will have to be treated as a separate procurement, outside of the resulting standing offers.



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# 1.3 Security Requirements

A. There is no security requirement applicable to the Standing Offer.

# 1.4 Debriefings

A. Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

## **PART 2 - OFFEROR INSTRUCTIONS**

## 2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

- A. All instructions, clauses and conditions identified in the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) by number, date and title are set out in the <u>Standard Acquisition Clauses and Conditions Manual</u> (https://buyandsell.gc.ca/policy-and-guidelines/standard-acquisition-clauses-and-conditions-manual) issued by Public Works and Government Services Canada.
- B. Offerors who submit an offer agree to be bound by the instructions, clauses and conditions of the RFSO and accept the clauses and conditions of the Standing Offer and resulting contract(s).
- C. The <u>2006 (2019-03-04)</u> Standard Instructions Request for Standing Offers Goods or Services Competitive Requirements, are incorporated by reference into and form part of the RFSO.
  - (i) Section 02, Procurement Business Number, is deleted in its entirety;
  - (ii) Section 05, Submission of offers, subsection 2, paragraph d., is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
    - d. send its offer only to the Department of National Defence location specified on page 1 of the RFSO or to the address specified in the RFSO, as applicable.
  - (iii) Subsection 5.4 of <u>2006</u>, Standard Instructions Request for Standing Offers Goods or Services Competitive Requirements, is amended as follows:

Delete: 60 days Insert: 120 days

(iv) Section 07, Delayed offers, is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

07 Delayed offers

- It is the Offeror's responsibility to ensure that the Contracting Authority has received the entire offer. Misrouting or other electronic delivery issues resulting in late delivery of offers will not be accepted.
- (v) Section 08, Transmission by facsimile or by epost Connect, is deleted in its entirety; and
- (vi) Section 20, Further information, is deleted in its entirety.

## 2.2 Submission of Offers

- A. Offers must be submitted only to Department of National Defence (DND) by the date, time and place indicated on page 1 of the RFSO.
- B. Due to the nature of the Request for Standing Offers, transmission of offers by facsimile to DND will not be accepted.

## 2.2.1 Electronic Submissions

A. Individual e-mails exceeding five (5) megabytes in size, or those including other factors such as embedded files, macros, and/or links, may be rejected by DND e-mail system and/or firewall(s) without notice to the Offeror or Contracting Authority. Larger offers may be submitted through more than one e-mail. DND will confirm receipt of documents. It is the responsibility of the Offeror to ensure that their entire offer submission has been received. Offerors must not assume that all documents have been received unless DND confirms receipt of each document. Due to the



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possibility of e-mail rejection and/or other technical issues, Offerors are requested to allow sufficient time before the closing time and date to submit their Offer and for DND to confirm receipt. Offer documents **received** after the closing time and date will not be accepted.

## 2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

- A. All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.
- B. Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

## 2.4 Applicable Laws

- A. The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.
- B. Offerors may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their offer, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the offerors.

- B. Prices must appear in the financial offer only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the offer.
- C. Canada requests that offerors follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of hard copy of their offer:
  - (i) use 8.5 x 11 inch (216 mm x 279 mm) paper; and
  - (ii) use a numbering system that corresponds to the RFSO.

## Section I: Technical Offer

A. In their technical offer, offerors should explain and demonstrate how they propose to meet the requirements and how they will carry out the Work.

#### Section II: Financial Offer

A. Offerors must submit their financial offer in accordance with the Attachment 1 to Part 3 – Pricing Schedule and the Attachment 2 to Part 3 - Pricing Schedule – Optional Laboratory Blind Testing Material

## 3.1.1 Electronic Payment of Invoices - Offer

- A. If you are willing to accept payment of invoices by Electronic Payment Instruments, complete Attachment 3 to Part 3 Electronic Payment Instruments, to identify which ones are accepted.
- B. If Attachment 3 to Part 3 Electronic Payment Instruments is not completed, it will be considered as if Electronic Payment Instruments are not being accepted for payment of invoices.
- C. Acceptance of Electronic Payment Instruments will not be considered as an evaluation criterion.

## 3.1.2 Exchange Rate Fluctuation

A. The requirement does not offer exchange rate fluctuation risk mitigation. Requests for exchange rate fluctuation risk mitigation will not be considered. All offers including such provision will render the offer non-responsive.

## 4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

- A. The price of the offer will be evaluated as follows:
  - (i) Canadian-based offerors must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties and excise taxes included, and Applicable Taxes excluded.
  - (ii) Foreign-based offerors must submit firm prices, Canadian customs duties, excise taxes and Applicable Taxes excluded. Canadian customs duties and excise taxes payable by Canada will be added, for evaluation purposes only, to the prices submitted by foreign-based offerors.
- B. Unless the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) specifically requires offers to be submitted in Canadian currency, offers submitted in foreign currency will be converted to Canadian currency for evaluation purposes. The rate given by the Bank of Canada in effect on the RFSO closing date, or on another date specified in the RFSO, will be applied as a conversion factor to the offers submitted in foreign currency.
- C. Although Canada reserves the right to issue the Standing Offer either on an FOB plant or FOB destination, Canada requests that offerors provide prices FOB their plant or shipping point and FOB destination. Offers will be assessed on an FOB destination basis.

#### 4.2 Basis of Selection

#### 4.2.1 Basis of Selection - Lowest Price Per Point

- A. To be declared responsive, a bid must:

  - (iii) obtain the required minimum of 60 percent overall (60 points) for the technical evaluation criteria which are subject to point rating. The rating is performed on a scale of 100 points.
- B. Offers not meeting (i) or (ii) or (iii) above will be declared non-responsive. Neither the responsive bid that receives the highest number of points nor the one that proposed the lowest price will necessarily be accepted. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price per point will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

## PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- A. Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a standing offer.
- B. The certifications provided by offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.
- C. The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.


## 6.4 Term of Standing Offer



  - (ii) One (1) copy must be forwarded or e-mail to the Standing Offer Authority identified under the section entitled "Authorities" of the Standing Offer.

#### 6.6 Insurance

A. The Contractor is responsible for deciding if insurance coverage is necessary to fulfill its obligation under the Contract and to ensure compliance with any applicable law. Any insurance acquired or maintained by the Contractor is at its own expense and for its own benefit and protection. It does not release the Contractor from or reduce its liability under the Contract.

## 6.7 Defence Contract

- A. The Contract is a defence contract within the meaning of the Defence Production Act, R.S.C. 1985, c. D-1, and must be governed accordingly.
- B. Title to the Work or to any materials, parts, work-in-process or finished work must belong to Canada free and clear of all claims, liens, attachments, charges or encumbrances. Canada is entitled, at any time, to remove, sell or dispose of the Work or any part of the Work in accordance with section 20 of the *Defence Production Act*.

## 6.8 Excess Goods

A. The quantity of goods to be delivered by the Contractor is specified in the Contract. The Contractor remains liable for any shipment in excess of that quantity whether the excess quantity is shipped voluntarily or as a result of an error by the Contractor. Canada will not make any payment to the Contractor for goods shipped in excess of the specified quantity. Canada will not return the said goods to the Contractor unless the Contractor agrees to pay for all the costs related to the return, including but not limited to administrative, shipping and handling costs. Canada will have the right to deduct such costs from any invoice submitted by the Contractor.

## 6.9 Labelling

A. The Contractor must ensure that the manufacturer's and specification numbers appear on each item, either printed on the container or on an adhesive label of highest commercial standard affixed to the container.

# 6.10 Delivery of Dangerous Goods/Hazardous Products

- A. The Contractor must mark dangerous goods/hazardous products which are classed as dangerous/hazardous as follows:
  - (i) shipping container in accordance with the <u>Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act</u>, 1992, c.
  - (ii) immediate product container in accordance with the <u>Hazardous Products Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. H-3.
- B. The Contractor must provide bilingual Safety Data Sheets, indicating the NATO Stock Number as follows:
  - (i) two hard copies:
    - a. one copy to be enclosed with the shipment, and
    - b. one copy to be mailed to:

- C. The Contractor will be responsible for any damages caused by improper packaging, labelling or carriage of dangerous goods/hazardous products.
- D. The Contractor must ensure they adhere to all levels of regulations regarding dangerous goods/hazardous products as set forth by federal, provincial and municipal laws and by-laws.

E. The Contractor must contact the consignee (i.e. Supply Depot Traffic Section) at least 48 hours before shipping dangerous goods/hazardous products in order to schedule a receiving time.

## 6.11 Transportation of Dangerous Goods/Hazardous Products

A. The Contractor must obtain the authorization from the Department of Transport to transport dangerous goods/hazardous products before the carrier may accept a charter involving the transportation of dangerous goods/hazardous products.

## 6.12 Dangerous Goods / Hazardous Products - Labelling and Packaging Compliance

- A. The Contractor must ensure proper labelling and packaging in the supply and shipping of dangerous goods/hazardous products to the Government of Canada.
- B. The Contractor will be held liable for any damages caused by improper packaging, labelling or carriage of dangerous goods/hazardous products.
- C. The Contractor must clearly mark all merchandise labels with the percentage of volume that is a hazardous item. Failure to do so will result in the Contractor being held responsible for damages caused in the movement of goods/products by government vehicles or government personnel.
- D. The Contractor must adhere to all applicable laws regarding dangerous goods/hazardous products.

## 6.13 Shipping Instructions - Free on Board Destination and Delivered Duty Paid

A. FOB Destination as per Appendix 1 to Annex A including all delivery charges and customs duties and Applicable Taxes.

## 6.14 Inspection and Acceptance

A. The Project Authority is the Inspection Authority. All reports, deliverable items, documents, goods and all services rendered under the Contract are subject to inspection by the Inspection Authority or representative. Should any report, document, good or service not be in accordance with the requirements of the Statement of Work and to the satisfaction of the Inspection Authority, as submitted, the Inspection Authority will have the right to reject it or require its correction at the sole expense of the Contractor before recommending payment.

Department of National Defence (DND) Canadian Forces Health Services (CFHS) support the health of 65000 military members and produces approximately 1,600 000 workload units per year. There are 14 laboratories across Canada that provides external clinic testing.

As per Accreditation Canada standard, ISO 15189 art 3.8 and CSA Z902-10 art 4.3.3, the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) laboratories are required to have a proficiency testing program for most of the test done in the clinics. Therefore CFHS has to test the equipment of all laboratories. A minimum of three (3) events per test per year are mandatory in order to maintain its accreditation.

#### 3. OBJECTIVE

The objective is to acquire Laboratory Blind Testing Material to test laboratory equipment in order to ensure high quality laboratory results and safe practice for patient. 

- 8.3 Provide an annual delivery schedule for the test event within 20 business days of contract award and at the beginning of each year.

## 9. ACCREDITATION

9.1 The Contractor must hold a current Accreditation ISO 17043.
