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## PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

### 1.1 Statement of Requirement

## 2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

## 2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Manitoba.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

### 3.1 Bid Preparation Instructions

Prices must appear in the financial bid only. No prices must be indicated in any other section of the bid.

Canada requests that bidders follow the format instructions described below in the preparation of hard copy of their bid:

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## 4.2 Basis of Selection

### 4.2.1 Basis of Selection - Mandatory Technical Criteria

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## ANNEX "A" – STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT

To supply and install a digital microscope hybrid system in accordance with the specifications detailed in Annex A, for Canadian Food Inspection Agency, National Center for Foreign Animal Diseases – Winnipeg, MB. Delivery, installation and training is mandatory by March 31, 2020.

**Introduction:** At the National Center for Foreign Animal Diseases – Winnipeg, the Pathology section plays a key role in the diagnosis and research of Foreign Animal Disease and requires a high quality microscope to carry out this function. They also require the ability to have a shared view of slide images to enable pathologist, technologists and collaborators to simultaneously view and discuss the slides. A digital microscope hybrid system has the capability to both act as a microscope to view slides live in real time as well as to scan slides on multiple levels to enable a focusable scanned image that can be saved. This new technology is ergonomic, can be viewed by numerous people at once (not limited by the number of view heads on the scope), can be shared between the Containment Level 3 (CL3) and CL2 areas without worry of decontamination of the slides, and the scanned image can be shared with others if a consult is required. Image analysis software can also be applied to scanned images that will allow us to quantitatively assess immunohistochemistry and/or in situ hybridization staining for presence of virus or other cell markers when required by project investigators.
