I am interested in applying for the above-noted contract though I understand that I would require a security clearance to apply for this tender. As a result of this, I am looking for a sponsoring Purchase Officer (PO) to re-obtain my security clearance in accordance with Public Services and Procurement Canada Contract Security Program. I am reaching out to you in hopes that you would act as my sponsoring PO for my security clearance.

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**ANSWER #4**

Yes.

**QUESTION #5**

MT.5 requires 36 months of ADDIE experience. The military adopted the ADDIE model of instructional design in the 1970s and evolved it overtime into the military's current approach named the Canadian Forces individual Training and Evaluation System (CFITES). Will the Crown accept CFITES as an equivalent to ADDIE instructional design for MT.5?

**ANSWER #5**

Yes, Canada will accept CFITES model.

The MT.5 of the Table **MANDATORY TECHNICAL CRITERIA** is amended as follows.

<b>MT.5</b>	The Bidder must demonstrate that the proposed resource has a minimum of thirty-six (36) months of demonstrated experience in developing and designing training using the ADDIE <sup>1</sup> model <sup>2</sup> for instructional design, or <b>the Canadian Forces individual Training and Evaluation System (CFITES) model.</b>
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**QUESTION #6**

MT.5 requires 36 months of ADDIE instructional experience. Will the Crown accept 36 months of instructional design work by a resource where they designed and developed courses and required materials to be taught in public, recognized universities across Canada?

**ANSWER #6**

No, Canada will not accept this model because it does not follow the ADDIE model, or the CFITES model, it follows the critical thinking instructional design model. It is an operational requirement that the ADDIE model, or the CFITES model be used to develop this training.
