1.1 Introduction

1.2 Summary

To supply and deliver dairy items, as specified in Annex "B", to the Department of National Defence (DND) at CFS Alert and Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Trenton in Trenton, Ontario on an "as and when requested" basis.

For items to be delivered to CFS Alert: Delivery of these items is to be made to the CFB Trenton, Trenton, Ontario, for furtherance by DND to CFS Alert

The offeror can submit pricing on as many or as few line items as they wish. Offers will be evaluated on the highest amount of line items offered and then on a line item basis.

The Request for Standing Offer may result in the issuance of up to three (3) Standing Offers.

The period of the Standing Offer is from March 01, 2020 to May 31, 2020 with an option to extend for 3 additional one month periods.

The Standing Offer holders will be given the opportunity to rebid their pricing for option period 1, option period 2 and option period 3 as outlined in Annex B.

The requirement is subject to the provisions of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA).

This RFSO allows offerors to use the epost Connect service provided by Canada Post Corporation to transmit their offers electronically. Offerors must refer to Part 2 of the RFSO entitled Offeror Instructions and Part 3 of the RFSO entitled Offer Preparation Instructions, for further information on using this method.

1.3 Debriefings

Offerors may request a debriefing on the results of the request for standing offers process. Offerors should make the request to the Standing Offer Authority within 15 working days of receipt of the results of the request for standing offers process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

2.2.1 Firm Price and/or Rates

The Offeror is required to submit firm prices, rates or both that will apply for the entire period of the Standing Offer.

2.3 Enquiries - Request for Standing Offers

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Standing Offer Authority no later than 7 calendar days before the Request for Standing Offers (RFSO) closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Offerors should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the RFSO to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by offerors to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that offerors do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all offerors. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all offerors may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

The Standing Offer and any contract resulting from the Standing Offer must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

3.1 Offer Preparation Instructions

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Offers will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the Request for Standing Offers including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the offers.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

4.1.2.1 Mandatory Financial Criteria

The Offeror must complete and submit with its offer, Annex B (Excel File attached). Pricing must be provided for any line item the Offeror is submitting an offer.

For Annex B – where an item has Additional Description, only items with that Specific Description will be acceptable.

Where the Offeror proposes an alternate UOIS (Unit of Issue Size), the Offeror must enter an amount for both PACK AND SIZE under Proposed Packaging.

The estimated usages provided in Annex B are for the sole purpose of establishing an evaluation tool. These usages are based only on best estimate and in no way reflect the actual usages expected or any commitment on part of the crown.

The Offeror must provide a maximum mark-up percentage for Special Orders. If left blank, an amount of 0% will be assumed and used in the subsequent Standing Offer.

A maximum of three (3) Standing Offers will be awarded.

The offers will be reviewed based on the number of line items submitted by each Offeror. The three (3) offers with the highest amount of line items submitted will be deemed qualified offers and be evaluated on a line item basis and all other offers will not be reviewed. Each line item will be evaluated separately, with the lowest Firm Unit of Measure (UoM) Price being awarded the specific line item.

If all offers provide pricing for all line items, the total evaluated price of all line items will be used and the three (3) lowest price offers will be deemed qualified offers and then be evaluated on a line item basis and all other offers will not be reviewed. The total evaluated price is the sum of the Extended Price, Extended Price is calculated as the estimated usage multiplied by Firm UoM price.

If all offerors provide pricing for the same amount of line items (but not all line items), each line item will be evaluated separately and the three (3) offers with the highest amount of winning line items will be issued Standing Offers.

4.1.1.2 Unit of Issue Size

4.2 Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for Standing Offers and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive offer with the lowest evaluated price on an item by item basis will be recommended for issuance of a standing offer.

A maximum of three (3) Standing Offers will be awarded.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a standing offer.

The certifications provided by Offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

4.2 Period of Delivery

- Deliveries must be made in accordance with the time and date indicated on the call-up document.
- Delivery must be made within seventy-two (72) hours from receipt of a Call-Up document.
- Emergency deliveries must be made within twenty-four (24) hours from receipt of a Call-Up document at no additional cost.
- The Contractor must accept customer cancellations / amendments to call-ups if they occur twenty-four (24) hours in advance of delivery

4.3 Delivery Vehicle(s)

All goods must be delivered in vehicles which are clean, free of odours and free of any signs of rodent or insect activities.

The vehicle(s) utilized for the transportation must be considered as an extension of the company premises and as such the environment it presents must not put at risk the integrity of the food products.

4.4 Delivery Slips

The Contractor must supply a delivery slip with each delivery. The delivery slip will be used to compare what was shipped, actual count of products shipped to the products ordered on the call-up to determine acceptance of order.

4.5 Back Orders

Back Orders will not be accepted without prior written approval by the Project Authority identified in the call-up against the Standing Offer.

4.6 Discontinued Product

All discontinued products must be reported to the Contracting Authority immediately. The Contractor must replace the discontinued product with a comparable one that is equal cost until the replacement product is agreed upon and approved.

4.7 Substitutions

The Contractor must supply the products in the size quoted and outlined in the Basis of Payment. No deviation from that size will be acceptable unless the stated size is no longer available to the industry. The Contractor must notify the Standing Offer Authority to obtain their acceptance of the replacement size and prepare an amendment to reflect the change.

If the Contractor is proposing a substitute item, it must be with an item of equal or higher quality. A substitute product of lesser quality will not be accepted.

In the event that the Contractor is required to substitute an item in the Standing Offer with another item due to inventory shortages, the replacement item must match the specifications indicated in the Standing Offer and must be provided at the same unit price as the original item.

4.8 Inspection and Acceptance

Final inspection and acceptance of product(s) rests solely with the consignee at the point of delivery. All products supplied must be free of signs of deterioration, spoilage, filth, or damage by rodents or insects. The consignee has the right to reject products at the time of delivery and unacceptable product(s) must be removed immediately by the Offeror.

The Contractor must deliver the goods as per the Recommended Case Description or the Contractors Case Description.

The site authority will identify any discrepancies and/or short shipments of products at the time of delivery. The Contractor must issue a credit for all discrepancies and/or short shipments of products within seven (7) working days.

4.9 Rejections

Rejected items discovered after delivery must be picked up and replaced within one (1) working day of notification of the rejection.

Rejections also cover deliveries that are not completed in compliance with the delivery requirements under 4. Delivery.

4.10 Packaging

The Offeror is responsible for all costs for the supply, pickup, removal, disposal and recycling of empty pallets and shipping containers.

Items must be packaged to prevent cross-contamination. Like items by category are encouraged to be placed together and different categories must be separated. For example, raw meat must not be packaged together with fresh mushrooms if the Offeror holds more than one Standing Offer and is delivering different categories at the same time.

The offeror must use every effort to utilize environmentally friendly packaging.

5. Call-Ups

5.1 Acknowledgment of call-ups

- a. The Offeror must not proceed without receipt of a duly completed and authorized call-up.
