**THIS AMENDMENT IS RAISED TO EXTEND THE CLOSING DATE OF THE SOLICITATION  
AND RESPOND TO BIDDERS' QUESTIONS**

- Q40 The RFP calls for a spares proposal to be included in the RFP response (Attachment 1 to Par 3 Financial Bid Presentation Sheet). As DND's input is critical to the spares planning process, this activity is typically handled after Contract award at a provisioning parts conference and spares planning meeting. There is no provision for such meetings provided for in the SOW. How does the Crown intend to address the issue of spares planning?
- A40 DND felt special spares planning meetings were not required for such a relatively small and simple system (vis-à-vis a tank, truck, plane, ship etc.). Spares planning meetings are intended to be part of the regularly scheduled meetings (Kick off meeting, etc.), which have planned deliverables, including the ILS and training documents. The Contractor is to provide the spare parts costs and their estimate of quantities required for the initial 2 years support on the PPB/RSPL. These will form the basis of discussion after Contract Award used to determine the quantities required and spare parts list upon which the purchase order will be based.
- Q41 It is a requirement of the ISS Spares support that the Contractor provides and maintains an inventory to support the ADIS throughout its life. The support contract will be restricted to successive 2 year periods (4.0 Term of Contract pg 10 of 45 Vol 3 ADIS). These spares will be held specifically for the DND's ADIS. Will the Crown commit to purchase any excess ADIS specific inventory from the contractor at the end of the ISS Contract, given it would be unique to ADIS?
- A41 Incorrect. The ISS SOW requires the Contractor to purchase all spare parts required to complete a repair action. DND will then pay for these repair parts. The ISS SOW does not require the Contractor to store and hold spare parts for DND. It is not the intent for Canada to pay for a storage of spares. DND will only purchase spares held by the contractor that are authorized by the LCMM under a DND 626.
- Q42 Pre-Kick Off Meeting (PKM) at 4.3.3 page 21 of 59 Vol 2, The SOW identifies a requirement for a PKM to be held 2 working days following Contract Award. The PKM does not show up on Figure 1 Adis Timeline on Pg 39 of 59 Vol 2. The PKM is not called for anywhere else in the document. Please Clarify if this is a real requirement or a carryover from an earlier document.
- A42 This is a real requirement; it is a short teleconference to coordinate the KOM.
- Q43 Table 1: list of possible test substances: Of the 8 substances listed, only two (NH3 + DMMP) are included in Volume 2, Appendix AA1 List of Chemicals, Table B: List of Toxic Industrial Chemicals (TICs)
- a. Is it the intent for these additional substances to be detectable in the evaluation trial yet not a part of the core TICs?

- b. F-125 and F-22 are banned substances not permitted for production or import in the European Union. As such, they cannot be tested to be added to the sensor library.

A43 Please refer to Amendment 005, A14.

- a. In short, yes. The substances used in the DRDC lab trial were chosen because they are representative of the spectral wavelength of CWA and are less toxic than CWA. NH<sub>3</sub> and DMMP are of interest as TICs while still safer to use as simulants, while the others will have no operational impact. Altering the number of potential simulants used during the lab testing could compromise the validity and fairness of the testing, since up to 5 chemicals from the list of 8 including a blank will be used during the trials and the assessment is based on this number.
- b. If a bidder does not have the required spectra Canada can help in providing the signatures at different spectral resolutions, and also in different data format (ASCII text files, binary, etc.).
