Question 1	With regard to the above solicitation, we have noted that, among other criteria, the bidder must demonstrate that the proposed resources have a valid Compliance Environmental Auditor (CEA) certification issued by the Canadian Environmental Certification Approvals Board (CECAB). Is the certification delivered by the Quebec Association of Environmental Auditing (AQVE) also acceptable for MT1?
Answer 1	Note to Bidders: This Answer is no longer valid, please see Answer 5.
	The Department of National Defence is a federal organization with workplaces in the ten provinces and three territories. This being said, applicable environmental law includes federal legislation and requires a firm grasp of the laws in each province.
	The Quebec Association of Environmental Auditing (AQVE) awards the title of Compliance Environmental Auditor (CEA) according to the requirements of the Standards Council of Canada. The process for obtaining certification includes the need to demonstrate the skills acquired.
	Appendix C of the Certification Criteria Certified Environmental Auditor (CEA) on the AQVE site indicates:
	 [Translation] Scope of practice – The training must include a minimum of the following content for someone to be deemed to have acquired the skills required to practice environmental auditing in Quebec. Qualification in environmental law – Knowledge of the environmental acts and regulations of Quebec and Canada.

	The AQVE criteria seem designed for environmental compliance audits in Quebec.
	Since DND is a Canadian organization with a presence in Quebec and the nine other provinces and three territories, it is essential to have qualified auditors at the national level. There seems to be a discrepancy between the certification required by DND and AQVE's criteria to obtain a CEA, as well as a difference in scopes of practice. Given the risk level, DND is uneasy about accepting the AQVE's CEA certification as an equivalent.
	DND has thus examined the question and the solicitation will remain unchanged.
Question 2	The document in several sections (Page 18 RT2; Page 19 RT3; Page 43 RT2; Page 44 RT3) references ISO Registration Audits. The requirement relates to experience "leading ISO Registration Audits". Does this refer to a Third Party Registration audit (these are performed by a Registrar for the purpose of assessing conformity with the ISO 14001 Standard AND the granting of a Certificate of Registration. They are Certification or Accreditation audits) or to an internal audit at an organization which is registered to the ISO 14001 Standard for the purpose of assessing conformity with the ISO 14001 Standard in line with the Internal Audit requirements of the Standard?

Answer 2	National Defence is using the term "ISO 14001 registration audits" to mean: third party audits using qualified ISO 14001 Environmental Management Systems Lead Auditors that result in an accreditation body recognised by the Standards Council of Canada issuing a registration certificate (certification) to an organisation. Accreditation bodies and their scopes of application are published on the Standards Council of Canada web site: https://www.scc.ca/en/accreditation/management-systems/directory-of-accredited-bodies-and-scopes
Question 3	In terms of the performance of the environmental compliance audits, can the Department of National Defence indicate how many proposed audits are planned per year and the proposed location of the audits for year 1 to 3?
Answer 3	The Department of National Defence is seeking environmental compliance auditors on an as and when required basis. Each audit will be initiated through a Task Authorization that will be discussed with the Contractor before any work is conducted. Page 11 of 51 of the RFP provides an estimated level of service for the work to be conducted. Each audit is anticipated to be approximately 6 to 10 person days.
Question 4	Page 10 of 51 of the RFP document describes the contents required in Section III: Certifications and Section IV: Additional Information of bidder proposals. These two sections have the same text for the first paragraph – seeming to read that each of Sections III and IV of the proposal should provide certifications required under Part 5, and as applicable, any associated additional information. Can you please clarify the requirements for inclusion in each of Sections III and IV of proposal submissions? Thank you.
Answer 4	A.) Section III requires the Bidder to provide the information, if applicable, found in Part 5 of the RFP:
	- The Bidder should address each section in Part 5 as required and applicable;
	 Regarding Sections 5.1.1, 5.2.1, and 5.2.2. of Part 5, it is recommended that the Bidder read the links provided to determine whether or not these sections are applicable and if any additional information needs to be provided in the proposal.
	- The Bidder must certify in their proposal Sections 5.2.3.1, 5.2.3.2, and 5.2.3.3. The manner in which they choose to demonstrate certification is at the discretion of the Bidder.
	B.) Section IV requires the Bidder to provide additional information regarding:
	- their legal name;

Question 6	Page 19 of 51 indicates Rated Criteria RT3, which states that the Bidder should demonstrate that each of the proposed resources have experience leading ISO 14001 registration audits. Registration audits may only be completed by registrars, who have been granted this designation by the Standards Council of Canada. These organizations perform ISO registration audits only, and do not perform regulatory compliance audits. Please advise further and clarify the intention of Rated Criteria RT3.
Answer 6	See Answer 2.
Question 7	Page 36 of 51, Annex A – Statement of Work, Section 5 – Deliverables, implies in several areas that site work is required as part of conducting the required audits (for example, in s. 5.1.1, and throughout s. 5.2). However, in Section 6 – Location of Work (specifically in s. 6.1) the RFP Indicates that the Contractor will be expected to conduct the work at their own facilities.
	Can the Department please clarify its expectation for on-site vs. off-site work to be conducted at DND locations? In the case that on-site work is required at various Bases and Wings, can the Department please clarify whether travel and living expenses will be covered for locations outside of the NCR?

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Answer 7	Travel outside of the NCR will be reimbursed up to the amounts listed in Section 2.0 in Annex B – Basis of Payment. Any Travel required outside of the NCR will be specified in the resulting Task Authorizations.
Question 8	Page 48 of 51 includes Annex C – Non-Disclosure Agreement. Is this Agreement required to be signed and submitted with Bidders' proposal submissions, or is the intent to complete this Agreement following award, by successful Bidders only?
Answer 8	Annex C – Non Disclosure Agreement is not required to be submitted with the Bidder's proposal. It is required to be signed after contract award by the successful Bidder's proposed resources.
Amendment #3	The bid solicitation closing date is hereby extended to Wednesday , 15 April 2020 , 2:00pm EDT .
Question 9	In the recent Amendment (Answer 5 / Amendments # 1 and 2) a discrepancy in the Point Rated Technical Criterion (RT1) is noted. The Maximum Score for RT1 in the RFP in Attachment 1 to Part 4, Technical Criteria (Page 17 – Point Rated Technical Criteria) is 60 Points. In Appendix B to Annex A (Page 43) and in Amendment (Answer 5/ Amendment # 2) the Maximum Score is 30 points. Initially this Point Rated Technical Criterion (related to compliance audit experience) was rated as 60 points (30 per resource). Is the Maximum Score for RT1 60 points (30 for each resource)? There is a further discrepancy in the original RFP – RT3 (the criterion related to ISO Registration audits) is listed as 30 points on Page 19 and as 15 Points on Page 44. Please clarify the point ratings for RT1 and RT3.
Answer 9	Answer 5 / Amendment #1 pertains to ATTACHMENT 1 TO PART 4, TECHNICAL CRITERIA which describes the Technical Criteria for two (2) Environmental Compliance Auditors to be evaluated at bid closing. RT1 is max 60 points (max of 30 points per resource). RT3 is max 30 points (max of 15 points per resource). Answer 5 / Amendment #2 pertains to APPENDIX B TO ANNEX A – TASK AUTHORIZATION (TA) GRID which describes the Technical Criteria used to evaluate additional resources, if and when required, after Contract Award and called upon via the Task Authorization process described in Section 6.1.1 and APPENDIX A TO ANNEX A – TASKING ASSESSMENT PROCEDURE. The proposed additional resource will be evaluated individually, hence RT1 max is 30 points and RT3 max is 15 points.
Question 10	Section 5.2.3.1 of the RFP references submission of résumés for resources who are not employees of the Bidder. There is no other reference to a requirement to submit résumés for resources who are employees of the Bidder. Is this a requirement – should résumés for each resource be submitted.
Answer 10	Resumes are required as part of the Bidder's proposal in order to substantiate experience of the proposed resources, in addition to the other requirements listed in the RFP.
Question 11	For MT1, would a "non-practicing" status be acceptable for EP(CEA)?
Answer 11	A non-practicing EP(CEA) status is not acceptable.
