PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Introduction

The Request for Standing Offer (RFSO) is divided into seven parts plus attachments and annexes, as follows:

2. Summary

The Correctional Service of Canada (CSC) is looking for a Contractor to provide, as and when needed, the labor, products and equipment required to perform the disinfection services for all CSC's Institutions within the Quebec Region.

More than one Standing Offer may be awarded for this process. The Contractor may bid for one institution/region or more, according to his ability to serve the areas included in this RFSO.

The period of this Standing Offer is from the award until July 31^{st} , 2021 inclusively, with a possibility of two (2) additional one (1)-year periods.

This procurement is subject to the provisions of the Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA), the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), Canada free trade agreements with Chile/Colombia/Honduras/Panama and the Canada-Peru Free Trade Agreement.

3. Security Requirements

There are security requirements associated with the requirement of the Standing Offer. 3. Former Public Servant

Contracts awarded to former public servants (FPS) in receipt of a pension or of a lump sum payment must bear the closest public scrutiny, and reflect fairness in the spending of public funds. It does not include pensions payable pursuant to the <u>Canadian Forces Superannuation Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. C-17, the <u>Defence Services Pension Continuation Act</u>, 1970, c. D-3, the <u>Royal Canadian Mounted Police Pension Continuation Act</u>, 1970, c. R-10, and the <u>Royal Canadian Mounted Police Superannuation Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. R-11, the <u>Members of Parliament Retiring Allowances Act</u>, R.S. 1985, c. M-5, and that portion of pension payable to the <u>Canada Pension Plan Act</u>, R.S., 1985, c. C-8.

1. Evaluation Procedures

- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of CSC will evaluate the offers.

1.1. Technical Evaluation (does not apply)

1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

Offers will be evaluated to determine if they meet all mandatory technical criteria outlined in **Annex D – Evaluation Criteria**. Offers not meeting all mandatory criteria will be declared non-responsive and will be given no further consideration.

1.2 Financial Evaluation

1.2.1 The price of the offer will be evaluated in Canadian dollars, Applicable Taxes are excluded, FOB destination, Canadian customs and excise taxes are included.

Offers containing a financial offer other than the one requested at **Article 3. Section II: Financial Offer** of **PART 3 – OFFER PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS** will be declared non-compliant.

In the event of an error in the multiplication or addition of prices, the unit price will prevail.

2. Basis of Selection

An offer must comply with the requirements of the Request for a Standing Offer to be declared responsive. The Standing Offer will be awarded to the responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price per institution/region. A maximum of ten (10) Standing Offer may be awarded.

Please note that, for the purpose of the evaluation, the total bid price per institution/region will be calculated by adding the all-inclusive fixed hourly rates for the term of the Standing Offer and the option years.

In the event of a tie regarding the lowest total bid price for an institution or a region, the offeror with the most experience in disinfection services (according to the Registre des entreprises du Québec) will be awarded the Standing Offer.

Please note that the award of the Standing Offer is subject to compliance with the budget ceiling established for this process.

PART 5 - CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Offerors must provide the required certifications and additional information to be issued a Standing Offer.

The certifications provided by Offerors to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare an offer non-responsive, will have the right to set-aside a standing offer, or will declare a contractor in default, if any certification made by the Offeror is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly during the offer evaluation period, during the Standing Offer period, or during the contract period.

The Standing Offer Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Offeror's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Standing Offer Authority will render the offer non-responsive, result in the setting aside of the Standing Offer or constitute a default under the Contract.

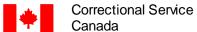

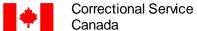
Closure of Government Facilities

Contractor personnel are employees of the Contractor and are paid by the Contractor on the basis of services rendered. 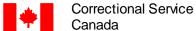

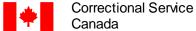

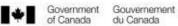

ANNEX D - INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor must obtain Commercial General Liability Insurance, and maintain it in force throughout the duration of the Contract, in an amount usual for a contract of this nature, but for not less than \$2,000,000 per accident or occurrence and in the annual aggregate.

The Commercial General Liability policy must include the following:

Additional Insured: Canada is added as an additional insured, but only with respect to liability arising out of the Contractor's performance of the Contract. The interest of Canada should read as follows: Canada, as represented by Public Works and Government Services Canada.

Bodily Injury and Property Damage to third parties arising out of the operations of the Contractor.

Products and Completed Operations: Coverage for bodily injury or property damage arising out of goods or products manufactured, sold, handled, or distributed by the Contractor and/or arising out of operations that have been completed by the Contractor.

Personal Injury: While not limited to, the coverage must include Violation of Privacy, Libel and Slander. False Arrest. Detention or Imprisonment and Defamation of Character.

Cross Liability/Separation of Insureds: Without increasing the limit of liability, the policy must protect all insured parties to the full extent of coverage provided. Further, the policy must apply to each Insured in the same manner and to the same extent as if a separate policy had been issued to each.

Blanket Contractual Liability: The policy must, on a blanket basis or by specific reference to the Contract, extend to assumed liabilities with respect to contractual provisions.

Employees and, if applicable, Volunteers must be included as Additional Insured.

Employers' Liability (or confirmation that all employees are covered by Worker's compensation (WSIB) or similar program).

Broad Form Property Damage including Completed Operations: Expands the Property Damage coverage to include certain losses that would otherwise be excluded by the standard care, custody or control exclusion found in a standard policy.

Notice of Cancellation: The Contractor will provide the Contracting Authority thirty (30) days prior written notice of policy cancellation or any changes to the insurance policy.

If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, coverage must be in place for a period of at least 12 months after the completion or termination of the Contract.

Owners' or Contractors' Protective Liability: Covers the damages that the Contractor becomes legally obligated to pay arising out of the operations of a subcontractor.

Sudden and Accidental Pollution Liability (minimum 120 hours): To protect the Contractor for liabilities arising from damages caused by accidental pollution incidents.

Litigation Rights: Pursuant to subsection 5(d) of the <u>Department of Justice Act</u>, S.C. 1993, c. J-2, s.1, if a suit is instituted for or against Canada which the Insurer would, but for this clause, have the right to pursue or defend on behalf of Canada as an Additional Named Insured under the insurance policy, the Insurer must promptly contact the Attorney General

of Canada to agree on the legal strategies by sending a letter, by registered mail or by courier, with an acknowledgement of receipt.

A copy of the letter must be sent to the Contracting Authority. Canada reserves the right to codefend any action brought against Canada. All expenses incurred by Canada to co-defend such actions will be at Canada's expense. If Canada decides to co-defend any action brought against it, and Canada does not agree to a proposed settlement agreed to by the Contractor's insurer and the plaintiff(s) that would result in the settlement or dismissal of the action against Canada, then Canada will be responsible to the Contractor's insurer for any difference between the proposed settlement amount and the amount finally awarded or paid to the plaintiffs (inclusive of costs and interest) on behalf of Canada.

ANNEX E – EVALUATION CRITERIA (does not apply)

1.0 Technical Evaluation:

- 1.1 The following elements of the offer will be evaluated and scored in accordance with the following evaluation criteria.
 - Mandatory Technical Criteria

It is <u>imperative</u> that the offer <u>address each of these criteria</u> to demonstrate that the requirements are met.

- 1.2 LISTING EXPERIENCE WITHOUT PROVIDING ANY SUBSTANTIATING DATA TO SUPPORT WHERE, WHEN AND HOW SUCH EXPERIENCE WAS OBTAINED WILL RESULT IN THE STATED EXPERIENCE NOT BEING CONSIDERED FOR EVALUATION PURPOSES.
- 1.3 All experience must be strictly work-related. Time spent during education and/or training will not be considered, unless otherwise indicated.
- 1.4 Experience must be demonstrated through a history of past projects, either completed or ongoing.
- 1.5 References must be provided for each project/employment experience.
 - I. Where the stated experience was acquired within a Canadian Federal Government Department or Agency as a Public Servant, the reference must be a Public Servant who had a supervisory role over the proposed resource during the stated employment.
 - II. Where the stated experience was acquired within a Canadian Federal Government Department or Agency as a consultant, the reference must be the Public Servant who was identified as the Project Authority of the project on which the proposed resource acquired the experience.
 - III. References must be presented in this format:
 - a. Name:
 - b. Organization;
 - c. Current Phone Number, and
 - d. Email address if available

1.6 Response Format

- In order to facilitate evaluation of offers, it is recommended that Offerors' offers address the mandatory criteria in the order in which they appear in the Evaluation Criteria and using the numbering outlined.
- II. Offerors are also advised that the month(s) of experience listed for a project or experience whose timeframe overlaps that of another referenced project or experience will only be counted once. For example: Project 1 timeframe is July 2001 to December 2001; Project 2 timeframe is October 2001 to January 2002; the total months of experience for these two project references is seven (7) months.
- III. For any requirements that specify a particular time period (e.g., 2 years) of work experience, CSC will disregard any information about experience if the technical offer does not include the required month and year for the start date and end date of the experience claimed.

IV. CSC will also only evaluate the duration that the resource actually worked on a project or projects (from the start date to end date), instead of the overall start and end date of a project or a combination of projects in which a resource has participated.
