- **Q1.** Regarding the Statement of Work as outlined in Annex A: Is there an estimated budget or maximum available budget for this study?
- **A1.** The maximum budget for this study is \$100,000.
- Q2. Regarding the requirements discussed under Annex A sections 5.0 and 6.0: While we understand that a minimum of 1,060 firefighters, 200 police, and 50 paramedics in Canada must be consulted and that participants must be given different options for participating (phone conversation, online survey, etc), are there any expectations around the breakdown of interviews vs. surveys? I.e., total number of interviews completed vs. total number of surveys completed among the total sample of approx. 1,300 participants.
- **A2.** We do not have defined expectations for the number of interviews vs surveys. However, we expect interviews to be conducted in every region of Canada and to represent firefighters, police and paramedics. We recognize that some of these questions may be difficult to obtain meaningful answers with an online survey, therefore we are expecting that some questions to be reserved for to be answered with an interview.
