- Q1. Soft vs. hard copies. On the RFP cover page, there is mention that bids should be returned to: Transport Canada, Mail Room (Food Court Level), Tower "C", Place de Ville, 330 Sparks Street, Ottawa. Also, at page 8, the bidders are requested to provide their bid in separately bound sections, in soft copies. Can you clarify whether bids must be submitted by standard or electronic mail? In the latter case, can you please specify what email address should be used?

- **Q2.** Information on Canadian practices. At page 21 of the RFP, under 5.0 Tasks to Be Performed, the contractor is required to prepare written reports for TC documenting "…recommendations, and strategies to improve the performance of the shipping document." Also, at page 4, there is an indication to the effect that the scan of Canadian practices is *not* to be included in the scan. During project execution, will Transport Canada be providing additional information on Canadian practices, beyond the guidelines laid out in Part 3 of the *Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulations* (SOR/2001-286)?
