Questions and Answers #1

Question 1

Our question relates to the scope of the research work. Is outreach/consultation with indigenous peoples in scope of this work?

Answer 1

Outreach/consultation with indigenous peoples is outside the scope of work for this contract.

The purpose of this contract is to review the existing literature as it pertains to culturally-relevant activities and culturally-competent methodologies in the implementation and evaluation of crime prevention programs.

It is possible that a future contract may include outreach/consultation with Indigenous populations to further contextualize and understand the findings from this initial literature review.

Question 2

Is this study part of a larger strategy development effort?

Answer 2

The study is being conducted in support of the National Crime Prevention Strategy (NCPS), which aims reduce crime by targeting at-risk groups in the population by funding evidence-based intervention programs and knowledge dissemination projects.
