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PART 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Security Requirements

1. At the date of bid closing, the following conditions must be met:

1.2 Statement of Requirement

The requirement is detailed under Article 6.2 of the resulting contract clauses.

1.3 Debriefings

Bidders may request a debriefing on the results of the bid solicitation process. Bidders should make the request to the Contracting Authority within 15 working days from receipt of the results of the bid solicitation process. The debriefing may be in writing, by telephone or in person.

1.4 epost Connect service

This bid solicitation allows bidders to use the epost Connect service provided by Canada Post Corporation to transmit their bid electronically. Bidders must refer to Part 2 entitled Bidder Instructions, and Part 3 entitled Bid Preparation Instructions, of the bid solicitation, for further information.

PART 2 - BIDDER INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Standard Instructions, Clauses and Conditions

2.2 Submission of Bids

Note: Bids will not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. It is the Bidder's responsibility to ensure the request for opening an epost Connect conversation is sent to the email address above at least six days before the solicitation closing date.

Bids transmitted by facsimile or hardcopy to PWGSC will not be accepted.

Note: Bids will not be accepted if emailed directly to this email address. This email address is to be used to open an epost Connect conversation, as detailed in Standard Instructions 2003, or to send bids through an epost Connect message if the bidder is using its own licensing agreement for epost Connect.

2.3 Enquiries - Bid Solicitation

All enquiries must be submitted in writing to the Contracting Authority no later than 10 calendar days before the bid closing date. Enquiries received after that time may not be answered.

Bidders should reference as accurately as possible the numbered item of the bid solicitation to which the enquiry relates. Care should be taken by Bidders to explain each question in sufficient detail in order to enable Canada to provide an accurate answer. Technical enquiries that are of a proprietary nature must be clearly marked "proprietary" at each relevant item. Items identified as "proprietary" will be treated as such except where Canada determines that the enquiry is not of a proprietary nature. Canada may edit the question(s) or may request that the Bidder do so, so that the proprietary nature of the question(s) is eliminated, and the enquiry can be answered to all Bidders. Enquiries not submitted in a form that can be distributed to all Bidders may not be answered by Canada.

2.4 Applicable Laws

Any resulting contract must be interpreted and governed, and the relations between the parties determined, by the laws in force in Ontario.

Bidders may, at their discretion, substitute the applicable laws of a Canadian province or territory of their choice without affecting the validity of their bid, by deleting the name of the Canadian province or territory specified and inserting the name of the Canadian province or territory of their choice. If no change is made, it acknowledges that the applicable laws specified are acceptable to the Bidders.

2.5 Bid Challenge and Recourse Mechanisms

- (a) Several mechanisms are available to potential suppliers to challenge aspects of the procurement process up to and including contract award.

PART 4 - EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND BASIS OF SELECTION

4.1 Evaluation Procedures

- (a) Bids will be assessed in accordance with the entire requirement of the bid solicitation including the technical and financial evaluation criteria.
- (b) An evaluation team composed of representatives of Canada will evaluate the bids.

4.1.1 Technical Evaluation

4.1.1.1 Mandatory Technical Criteria

The bid must meet the mandatory technical criteria specified in Annex A and Annex D. Bidders must provide the necessary documentation to support compliance with this requirement.

Bids that fail to meet the mandatory technical criteria will be declared nonresponsive. Each mandatory technical criterion should be addressed separately.

Bidders must propose products meeting all mandatory technical specifications and components outlined in Annex A and Annex D.

To demonstrate that your products meet all mandatory technical specifications and components mentioned in Annex A and Annex D, Bidders must submit with their bid, proofs of compliance. "Proof of Compliance" is defined as an unaltered document, such as a brochure and/or technical literature and/or a third party test report provided by a nationally and/or internationally recognized testing facility and/or a report generated by a nationally and/or internationally recognized third party software.

Canada will evaluate only the documentation provided with a bidder's bid. Canada will not evaluate references to Web sites to find additional information, or technical manuals or brochures not submitted with the bid.

The document must provide detailed information on each performance requirement and/or specification.

4.1.2 Financial Evaluation

4.2 Basis of Selection

4.2.1 Basis of Selection - Mandatory Technical Criteria

A bid must comply with the requirements of the bid solicitation and meet all mandatory technical evaluation criteria to be declared responsive. The responsive bid with the lowest evaluated price will be recommended for award of a contract.

PART 5 – CERTIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Bidders must provide the required certifications and additional information to be awarded a contract.

The certifications provided by Bidders to Canada are subject to verification by Canada at all times. Unless specified otherwise, Canada will declare a bid non-responsive, or will declare a contractor in default if any certification made by the Bidder is found to be untrue whether made knowingly or unknowingly, during the bid evaluation period or during the contract period.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to ask for additional information to verify the Bidder's certifications. Failure to comply and to cooperate with any request or requirement imposed by the Contracting Authority will render the bid non-responsive or constitute a default under the Contract.

5.1 Certifications Required with the Bid

Bidders must submit the following duly completed certifications as part of their bid.

ANNEX "A" - STATEMENT OF REQUIREMENT

1.0 Requirement

The Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) has a requirement for purchase and delivery of ten (10) magnetic particle wet benches to conduct nondestructive testing magnetic particle inspections.

2.0 Specifications

The mandatory technical specifications and components listed below are the minimum requirements and do not constitute an exhaustive list.

Any technical specifications and components required for operation of the equipment and not described below are an integral part of this requirement and their cost is included in the firm lot price for the magnetic particle wet benches

Each magnetic particle wet bench must meet the minimum specifications as outlined below:

- (a) Three phase, full wave direct current (FWDC) rectification up to 6,000 amperes with selectable A/C waveform mode with up to 2,500 amps.
- (b) Contact and coil output modes including independently selectable output dials and ammeter display for circular and longitudinal field strengths
- (c) Five cable wraps on coil
- (d) Current (amperage) "on" safety indicator light
- (e) Quick break feature
- (f) Demagnetization capability
- (g) 600 (575) Volts operating voltage and 60 Hz operating frequency
- (h) A maximum test part length of 54 inches, maximum test part diameter of 18 inches, and a maximum test part weight of 300 lbs
- (i) Foot switch activated pneumatic tail stock or headstock
- (j) Ratcheting coil crank handle or hand moved coil
- (k) An external pump
- (l) Shot activating push bar
- (m) Hand held wet magnetic media applicator with ergonomic trigger
- (n) Stainless steel particle tank
- (o) Hard wood grills
- (p) Flexible copper contact plates
- (q) Maximum overall size of machine footprint is 8 feet x 5 feet (2.44 meters X 1.52 meters)
- (r) LED UV light with inspection enclosure hood
- (s) Operator selectable single or double mag shot
- (t) Operator adjustable mag shot time
- (u) Machine repeatability down to 100 amps
- (v) Mag amperage settable
- (w) Programmable Logic Controller
- (x) Equipment must meet or exceed current CSA standards at time of delivery

3.0 Documentation

3.1 The following documents, in printed or electronic format for each magnetic particle wet bench must be provided in French and English with the delivery of each magnetic particle wet bench:

- a) User manual, including all the applicable safety procedures;
- b) Service and maintenance manual;
- c) Troubleshooting document (if applicable); and

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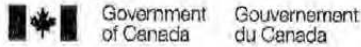
