Dimension of the space

Refer to "2019-08 Rough sketch of the Kivalliq Regional Visitor Centre displays" file to see the location of the exhibit, indicated by "Location A".

The wall space is approximately 55 inches wide on one wall and 72 inches on the other wall, but it should balance with other pictures along the wall so 41 inches on either wall would be approximately right for the width. Floor space is large 16 feet by 26 feet, but the exhibit should not take up all of that space. See the images.

Dimension of the space

There are two potential locations for the exhibit, location A and location B. Refer to "2019-08 rough sketch of the Baker Lake VC" file.

Location A is 61 inches by at least 100 inches. Location B is 69 inches by about 124 inches. Notes: The area is where the desk and window are. The wood colour and framing material and style are the key things to marry with the existing exhibits.

3. Naujaat Parks Canada Office

Dimension of the space

There are two walls in the Naujaat office that could be used. Refer to pictures Naujaat Office Location A and Naujaat Office Location B.

Location A (above the couch in the picture) is 108×108 inches and Location B is 108×70 inches. The smallest door to access the area is 83 inches by 34.5 inches.

Note: This is a typical government office built in the last 10 years, with drywall, painted doors, durable linoleum finish. The exhibit frame could be finished wood.
