

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS #3

This document addresses **one** (1) additional question (highlighted) that Infrastructure Canada (INFC) has received regarding RFP # INFC-2020/21-PS545.

Q7:

Will any services be required to decommission existing furniture that INFC does not intend to redeploy, thus eliminating unnecessary storage and double-handling costs? Note: there are companies who can divert furniture items away from landfills/dumps and instead find another use for them?

A7:

INFC follows the [Directive on Disposal of Surplus Materiel](#) on a case by case basis. The intent of this Request for Proposal is to obtain moving and storage services.

Q6:

Is the estimated value stated in question 2 the estimated annual or the estimated total value?

A6:

It is the estimated total value.

Q5:

Do the same response time apply to both the NCR and Montreal?

A5:

Bidders must submit a proposal for both regions in the same bid. The bid closure date applies to all Bidders for this requirement.

Q4:

Could work in NCR and Montreal happen on the same day?

A4:

Yes, that is possible.

Q3:

Would we need to bid and accommodate both NCR and Montreal to qualify?

A3:

Yes. One contract, one supplier.

Q2:

What would the value of this RFP be estimated to be?

A2:

That is unknown, although with many years of required services based on current prices of the relocation services standing offer, the total value is expected to exceed well over \$200,000.

Q1:

Who is currently doing this work?

A1:

Currently, no one is providing any services for INFC's Montreal office. At the moment, INFC has placed a call-up under the relocation services standing offer with Simplex for its NCR location to cover the next couple months, but that is insufficient. INFC is seeking only one supplier to cover both of its locations, which is a requirement outside the scope of that standing offer.
